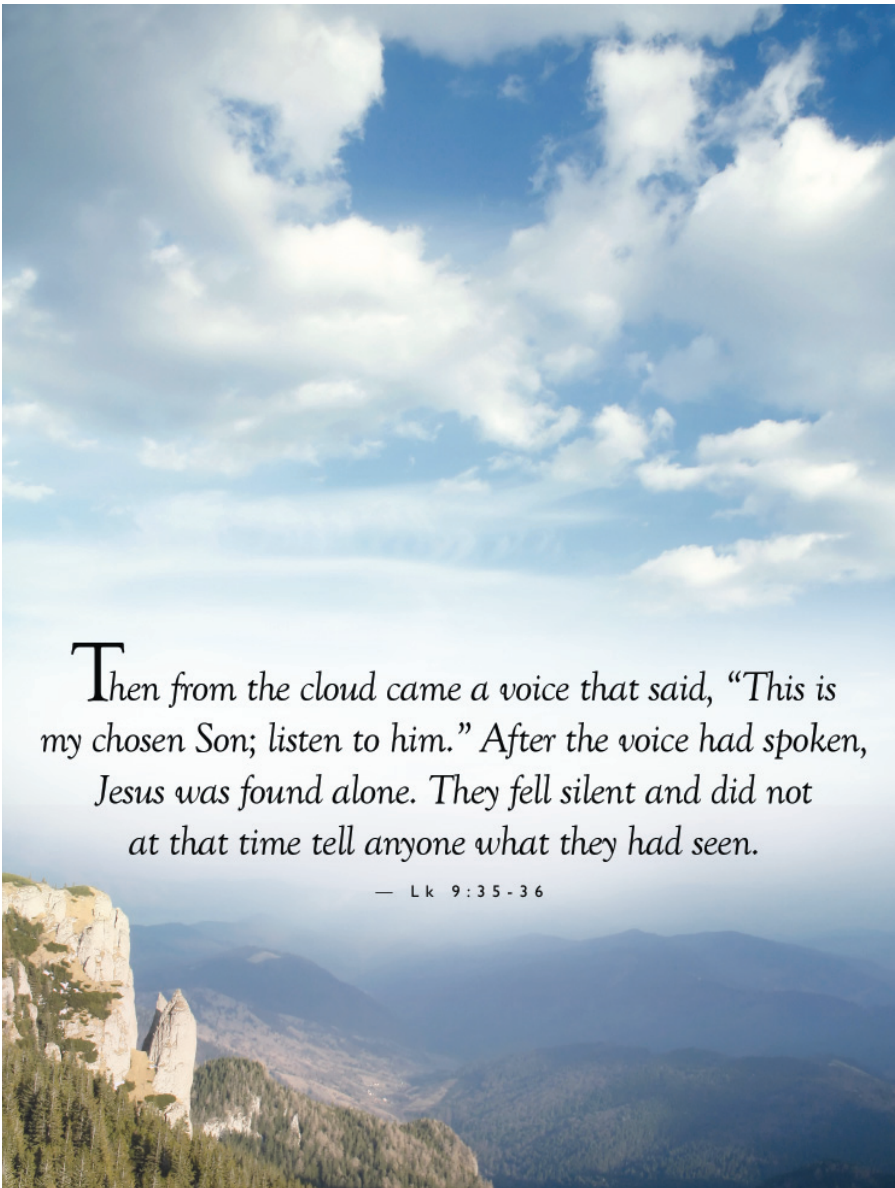

Dear Friends,

One of the events I am so impressed with at Holy Name is our outreach to Ascension. I asked for some history and here is one person's story:



"About 15 years ago a couple of men from the parish invited about a dozen of us to dinner to talk about Ascension and the importance of the St. Pat's Party. A couple of very passionate men told us why it was important to become involved with Ascension. Many of us toured Ascension in the following weeks and we learned first hand what could be done with a few dollars and how we could impact the lives of the kids who went there. In North Minneapolis there are not a lot of bastions of hope, but Ascension provides the beacon and tools so that kids can be kids and they get the opportunity to excel and use their many God-given talents to pursue their passions. They are given love, respect, challenge, reward and a foundation.

Many of us who attended this meeting had children at Holy Name School and already were "supporting" Catholic education, but we made the commitment to sell or buy \$1000 of St. Pat's raffle tickets. Over the next few years we recruited another eighteen men and women who promised to do the same, our wives became involved and the event flourished. For many, it was a stretch with mortgages, kids, college funds, etc., but I think most would say it was the best money they spent. This has been a uniting cause for us and it has been a joy to see how Ascension has continued to flourish with good leadership and outstanding academic progress.

And the party . . . well, it's just a lot of fun! Good food, great conversation and entertainment, a high class pub atmosphere and some fun things to bid on, the night goes too quickly. Think of it as a mini-Basilica Block Party – without the parking problems or the long drive to get there."

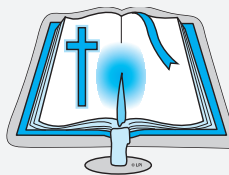

Stations of the Cross for Seniors

Noon - Friday, March 5

There will be a special Stations of the Cross for Seniors at Noon on Friday, March 5, in the church put on by our Pastoral Care Ministry. There will be a simple Lenten Soup Luncheon after the Stations in the Fireside Room. *Please RSVP for the Soup Luncheon.* Participants are asked to bring an item for the food shelf to help those who are in need.

We are reminded that the Christian devotion of praying the Stations of the Cross began in the earliest centuries after Christ. Pilgrims who traveled to Jerusalem would walk along the Via Crucis (The Way of the Cross), today referred to as the Via Dolorosa (The Way of Sorrows). This is the route believed to have been walked by Jesus as He carried His cross from the site of His condemnation at Gabbatha, the stone pavement at the Antonia Fortress, to the site of His crucifixion on Golgotha outside the city walls. At several places along the route, the pilgrims would stop to recall some event from Jesus' passion. This practice continued for a thousand years, but only in Jerusalem.



Beginning in the 14th Century, the Franciscans brought this devotional practice to Europe. A series of shrines would be established along a route, and pilgrims would journey from one Station to the next. Increasingly, the Stations came to be closer together. Eventually, especially in northern climates, the Stations were moved inside the church, and as the centuries passed, it became common for them to be seen as pictures on the wall of the church rather than a path of prayer to serve a stational (moving) devotion. Many Catholics today have prayed the Stations of the Cross without moving at all – simply remaining stationary at a pew listening to a presider read reflections. As this devotional is being practiced today various emphases to meet the spiritual needs of participants have been adapted. On Friday, March 5, we will have a special focus for those who are aging. All are welcome however. Maybe if you have some elderly parents or friends you can pray these stations especially for them. Join us.
