Dear Friends,

Welcome to these high Holydays of the Christian church. We begin the most holy of weeks with the celebration of Palm Sunday. We recall Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a burst of color and song. It is short lived as we face the reality of His suffering and death as proclaimed in the Passion according to Mark. The reality of what we remember and recall is thrust before us. We know that this week is different.



We then move into the celebration of the Triduum (the three days before Easter). We begin on Holy Thursday with the washing of feet and hearing our call to service. We remember the institution of the Eucharist, our food on the Christian journey. We then begin our Watchfire, which is lit after the ending of this service. We light the fire and watch and pray, remembering His suffering and our responsibility to follow. Different groups of families, different ministries, and others will be gathering and praying. Some will pray from the Scriptures, others will pray the Rosary, others will sing while others will spend the time in conversation. There will be somebody praying at the Watchfire until the new fire is blessed as the Holy Saturday night Vigil begins. Please feel free to come and spend some time with us.

We gather on Good Friday to commemorate the death of Jesus. The journey of the suffering and the cross that Jesus endured will be remembered. The Passion of John will be sung and the cross will be venerated. The wood of the cross, on which hung our Savior, is honored and is a focus of our worship. Saturday is made truly holy by the retelling of the scriptural revelation of God. Many of the stories of our faith are proclaimed that evening. We will celebrate the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation and renew our commitment to live the new life won by Jesus Christ. Please come and be a part of our worship.

Sunday will be a bursting forth of baptismal renewal and Alleluias. Many will gather to celebrate the Good News of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The victory over death and sin will be announced and proclaimed again and again. Come and pray with us and please give yourself enough time to move through the traffic. Our times are all changed on this one Sunday. Please note the Mass schedules listed on this page. I thank you ahead of time for your generosity on this great feast of Easter.

## What is the Altar of Repose?

The altar of repose is an altar in a Roman Catholic Church where the Communion hosts, consecrated in the Mass on Holy Thursday, are reserved.

In the Roman Catholic Church it is prescribed that the altar of repose be in the church or other suitable location, and that it be a different altar from the one where the Mass is celebrated. The reserved consecrated Hosts remain in a ciborium on the corporal in the center of the altar till the end of Mass, which is then carried in solemn procession to the altar of repose, often featuring use of the Humeral Veil and Candle Bearers. The Blessed Sacrament remains in the temporary tabernacle at the altar of repose. The Holy Thursday service concludes with the stripping of all altars except the altar of repose.

After the Good Friday service, the Blessed Sacrament remains available as viaticum for the dying. While the Blessed Sacrament remains in this temporary tabernacle at the altar of repose, a lamp or candle is kept burning before it.

The altar of repose at Holy Name of Jesus will be located in the Fireside Room. Adoration and prayer will take place until Midnight on Holy Thursday Night.

Mention of the altar of repose and the procession to it is not found before the close of the fifteenth century. The reservation of the Consecrated Species in the Mass of Holy Thursday was for the distribution of Holy Communion.
