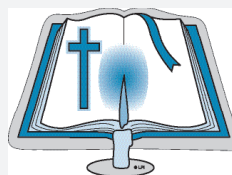
## First Eucharist News and Thank You Wishes...

## The Power of Healing Oils

We need healing at various stages of our lives. People experience all kinds of heart breaking losses and transitions: loss of relationships, loss of jobs, loss of health and well being. They all need the healing power of God's grace in the Sacrament of Anointing. We need the healing oil of God's grace. We need the saving "salve" of God's grace for our heart and body.

One of the most misunderstood (and overlooked) sacraments is the Sacrament of Anointing. We have tried recently to get the message out and to dispel traditional myths, but some people are still reticent and shy about asking for the "healing power" of the Sacrament of Anointing. They think that it is really for people who are dying. The traditional name is Extreme Unction (literally, last anointing). When people asked for Father to come give Grandma the last rites we knew it wasn't too long now for Grandma to pass away. It often frightened people. Of course, we've seen enough of the Hollywood versions of Spencer Tracy or war chaplains doing just that.

With the renewal of the liturgy and the sacraments in our time, we have tried to capture the meaning of the sacraments for today. The Catholic Church has a rich history of healing and reconciliation. We try to celebrate them in a more appropriate and meaningful way. We now have people request the Sacrament of Anointing before operations, when they having challenging life situations, when they slip into depression or other mental illnesses, when they are in hospice. There still are the life and death situations, but we have expanded the scope and appropriateness of the celebration of the sacrament. We now see that the Church also celebrates it communally and at various times of the year at Sunday Eucharist or special Masses for the elderly.

There are three distinct and integral aspects to the celebration of this sacrament:

*Prayer of faith*, the community, asking God's help for the sick, makes its prayer of faith in response to God's word and in a spirit of trust. The entire Church is made present in this community ~ represented by the priest, family, friends, and others ~ assembled to pray for those to be anointed. The sick person should also join in this prayer if able.

*Laying on of hands*: The gospels contain a number of instances in which Jesus healed the sick by the laying on of hands or even the simple gesture of touch. The laying on of hands is clearly a sign of blessing as we pray that by the power of God's healing grace the sick person may be restored to health or receive in case of death. The laying on of hands is also an *invocation* of the Holy Spirit upon the sick person.

*Anointing of Oil* signifies healing, strengthening, and the presence of the Holy Spirit. The instruction says there should be a generous use of the oil and it is not desirable to wipe off the oil after the anointing. We are encouraged to do this in large gatherings (communal rites) and liturgical celebrations. This sacrament forgives our sins. Just as with the Sacrament of Reconciliation we see the Church desirous of celebrating these sacraments communally and with joyous songs.

**All who would like to receive this sacrament should join our Senior Adults on Wednesday, May 12, at 10:00 a.m. as they celebrate God's healing power in their lives. All who would like to be anointed and prayed with at that time should sign up at the Parish Reception Desk.**
