Every year at Holy Name of Jesus, we have the tradition of supporting others through second collections. This tradition is a very generous one and it raises our minds and hearts to the different needs of our church and world.

Seven collections are authorized and requested by the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. Each of these has a separate envelope in your parish envelope packet.


These are collected, sent to the chancery, and distributed by the Bishops of the country. They include: Operation Rice Bowl, Holy Land/Good Friday, Global Solidarity Sunday, Peter's Pence, World Mission Sunday, Catholic Campaign for Human Development, and the Retirement Fund for the Religious.

Three of the collections are authorized and requested by the Archbishop of St. Paul and Minneapolis. These are: the missionary group that comes and speaks during the summer, and two new collections. One is for the St. Paul Cathedral, for it is in need of many repairs and much restoration work. The other is for The St. Paul Seminary, which educates our priests. These collections are taken and sent to the Archdiocese and our Archbishop distributes the funds.

The other second collections are decided by our Social Justice and Outreach Commission. They take the time and effort to choose places that our community is a part of and has reached out to in the past. These are: Sharing and Caring Hands, Peace Foundation, Ascension School, Common Hope/Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos, Respect Life, Interfaith Outreach and Community Partners and Store to Door. These collections are taken by the parish and distributed to the different groups. These programs were chosen after much homework and discussion by the Commission. We do receive many more requests.

Thank you for your generosity in supporting the parish as well as these other charitable organizations. Please do not feel that you must support all these recipients. Please pray and choose where you wish to place your tithe (the Biblical notion encourages five percent to the parish and five percent to other charities). Our hope is that you have the awareness of the need and the opportunity to respond both in prayer and financially. We provide the opportunities. There are many this fall, and I thought a little information might be helpful.

Administration Update

A portion of the New Generation of Ministry Campaign was designated to fund "ministry improvement" projects. The Pastoral Council approved a group to evaluate proposals for these funds and recently they approved the first of what will be many improvements. Strange as it may sound, the campaign's first purchase is something we hope we never have to use.

The campaign funded the purchase of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). The unit is designed to correct the heart beat for someone having a heart attack. Using it is very simple for pretty much anyone. The AED is installed by the front reception area along with an oxygen bottle and a first aid kit. Thank you to those who contributed to the campaign and helped fund this potentially lifesaving device.

You may have noticed we have installed new signs and pillars. The signs were a generous donation from Bob and Micky Pajor and the brick and electrical work was donated by a parishioner wishing to remain anonymous. The project was delayed as the parish sought to get a variance to keep the signs in the same location as the old signs. Unfortunately, the City of Medina denied the variance and so they are a little farther from the road but will still welcome all who come here for many years to come.

The parish closed the books on the fiscal year on June 30th. The good news is we finished the year better than our budget overall. The challenge is, and will be, allocating sufficient money to keep the building and grounds in good repair. Look for a complete parish annual report in the mail in the next month or so. 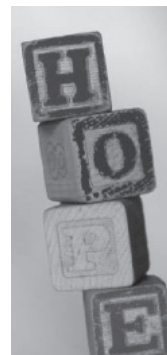
