## What is God's Dream for Holy Name of Jesus?

Part of that answer may have to do with choosing to do healthy things for our selves. There are several opportunities coming up that could help us in caring for the heart as well as the soul. My high school classmate, Fr. Mike Joncas, will be here this weekend to help us as a parish better understand this great Liturgy we celebrate each week. It will be an opportunity to better understand the process of *conversion*. It will provide a *connection* of all the ministers to a greater vision than just a task that needs to be done. It will call us to *contemplation* – giving us an understanding of how our Liturgy is set up to bring us to an awareness of God. You will find his presentation stimulating and thought provoking.



Also the parish is bringing to us Terry Shaughnessy, who has done much research on "Father Wound-Father Blessing." Every father has some wound from his father. The wound is evident in the absence of love or time that a father has for his son. Unless this wounding is recognized and addressed in a man's life, it is unconsciously passed onto the next generation of sons. Terry will help us recognize this heart message that needs to be healed and addressed in our lives on October 11.

Another part of God's dream for us would be to reflect on our dignity in this Respect Life month. We are challenged to look at the dignity of every person, from natural conception until natural death. The life of God is in us from conception on. We thus are to treat our bodies and ourselves with great reverence. We are to take responsibility to eat right, get enough sleep, exercise our intellect, our body and our soul as well as not abuse our body. We are asked to attend to those that God brings into our lives as well as those we have committed our lives to.

We are also asked to promote the dignity of every person. We are to work for the protection of every human person from conception until natural death. We are to work against abortion and all its causes (poverty) as well as euthanasia. We are against torture, the death penalty, and the use of any nuclear, chemical or biological weapon. We promote marriage and family life. We work for just wages, affordable and accessible health care, affordable housing, and sustainable agriculture. We will work against discrimination of any kind based on race, religion, sex, ethnicity, disabling condition, or age. We are to become aware of our unique position in the world and help address the scandal of poverty and underdevelopment. There's a lot for us to think and pray about.

Battering of women and children is often hidden in the community. Home Free Battered Women's Shelter provides a secure place for women and children and serves the western Metro area. Each year Home Free provides shelter for more than 600 women. They respond to over 2,000 calls per year. Stays vary in length, but the average stay is about two to three weeks. These services to women in need are free.

Home Free also has community programs for women and teens. They help women to obtain Orders for Protection, and they have community education and training. Their website is: [www.homefreetogether.org](http://www.homefreetogether.org).

The HNOJ KC Ladies host the Angel Auction every November. All proceeds go directly to Home-Free. Did you know that last year's Auction had more than 150 items in a silent auction as well as a live auction? A variety of refreshments are served at the event including spectacular desserts. We often have a talented crafter of the parish donate a special item that is auctioned off in the live auction.
