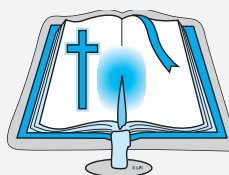

Shelter from the Storm

Thank you Holy Name of Jesus for all that you have done for Interfaith Outreach & Community Partners (IOCP) this past weekend! Several people at IOCP mentioned how moved they were with the support from our priests and parishioners.

The food shelf is very, very low on inventory. As you can imagine, there are a greater number of families coming in to use the food shelf than ever before. HNOJ parishioners continue to be very generous. Thank you for bringing in much needed cans of soup, fruits, and vegetables.

Adopt-a-Family Program is a wonderful holiday program giving an opportunity for would-be sponsors to provide Christmas gifts to those served by IOCP. HNOJ's goal was to link 10% of the families with parishioners. So far we have sponsored 34 families. **We need 16 more sponsors by Monday, November 16, to meet our goal.** As of today, there are only about 50% or 250 families successfully linked up out of the 492 families that signed up to be a part of this program. This is the first time that the Adopt-a-Family Program has not successfully linked everyone up in all of its 29 years! Contact Susan Fetterer at (952) 473-2436 to adopt a family.

The 14th Annual Sleep Out kicks off this weekend at Klapprich Field in Wayzata from 6:00-8:00 p.m. There are many activities planned and Mike Pomeranz of KARE 11 will be the emcee. Besides building community awareness of the housing needs in our community, IOCP has set the financial goal of \$2 million dollars to meet the needs of 1,000 people they will serve. The preliminary donation amount from HNOJ is \$17,300+.

Pastoral Care Notice for the Census: Be Cautious about Giving Information to Census Workers

The Better Business Bureau advises people to be cooperative but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud. A census worker has a badge, handheld device, Census Bureau canvas bag and confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card, or banking information. Even if they claim they need it for the census. Eventually, census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. They will not contact you by email so look out for email scams. Never click on or open attachments in an email that are supposedly from the Census Bureau. The census is important but be careful of scams.
