## Dear Friends,

God is Holy. God is absolutely different. God is transcendent. God is not creature nor created but always was, is now and always will be. Jesus Christ comes from God and is holy. Holiness, for humans, is a state of those who live in within the Trinitarian dynamic by which we are connected to the Father through the Son in the Spirit of God. This love and grace is poured out upon us to make us the children of God. We are holy because of our relationship with and attachment to God.



All are "called to be holy" (1Cor. 1:2). Holiness can thus be understood as a part of the conversion process: a move away from that which is not God (aversion) toward that which makes us closer to God after the manner of Jesus (conversion). The "call" is the urging grace of God while our conversion to God is a response to that prompting of grace. The call to be holy is within all people. We hear that call as individuals but also within the believing assembly of church.

Those in the Church respond to the call to holiness by hearing the word of God preached, sharing in the sacramental life of the Church, and living out those values and insights that we learn from Jesus Christ. The holiness of believers finds its model in Jesus Christ, who mirrors the holiness of God.

This is written to begin to peak our interest in how we hear and respond to this call. It also challenges us to look at our lives and see how we might take part in worship, church activities, ministries or offerings so as to grow in holiness. Begin to pray to discern how God might be urging you to participate. As we move toward the fall, we will hear about our call to Holiness.

## Why I Volunteer for Store to Door By Cheri Nispel

I have been volunteering for Store to Door as a caller/order taker since 1997. I have always worked with seniors and had just decided to retire from my sixteen-year career as a Speech Language Pathologist. I was expecting my third son, my older boys were ten and twelve, when I decided I needed to take time to raise my family. I had been working in nursing homes with seniors who suffered with speech, language, swallowing and hearing problems and have always had a passion for helping seniors. I was looking for something to do that involved seniors and I decided to give it a try and have never quit!

I have always loved doing the calls. Some people I have called for many years. They are so appreciate for the help, and love to visit. We become friends over the phone! It is so much easier now to take the orders with everything on-line. I started doing them on paper, and driving my sheets to someone that worked in the Store to Door office! Now it's just sign in and click away!!

One of the seniors I have called for about five years is 98 years old. She is so delightful to visit with, has a very sharp mind and is doing so amazingly well. She is always suggesting she may not make it till Wednesday when she gets her groceries. I call her on Mondays. One week, when I called, she was not going to order anything because she felt poorly and was sure she would not be here by Wednesday. We visited for a while; we even joked and laughed a little. I convinced her to go ahead and order what she needed and we would worry about the groceries if she was "not here." She ended up ordering a full order and even a large bottle of vitamins! I guess they were good vitamins because that was at least six months ago!

Store to Door is one of the reasons I started working with my new company SENIORS Helping SENIORS®. Both are there to give seniors the help they need to stay independent. Some seniors have friends and families to help, but if not, they may be able to stay out of a nursing home with this kind of help.

I don't see any reason to stop being a caller, even when I am out of town, if I have internet access, like this week at the lake, I can do my calls. It is very rewarding and I know I get out of it as much or more than I give.

We want to thank the parishioners of Holy Name for their contributions to Store To Door that occurred during our Second Offering weekend on May 14-16. Holy Name donors gave \$7,315.99 to support the work of keeping the homebound elderly independent, and giving them access to good nutrition. Thank you. Store To Door could not do it without your financial and volunteer support!



## Joseph and Louise Wierschem Scholarship Fund 2010 Update

Many of you may remember the Celebrate Joe and Louise Wierschem event which took place at Holy Name of Jesus in October of 2008. At this event, Ed Sweeney, Paul Camaroto and many other friends of the Wierschems took both Deacon Joe and Louise by surprise when it was announced that they had started the Joseph and Louise Wierschem Scholarship Fund.

The majority of Deacon Joe and Louise's life work here at Holy Name of Jesus has been based on the need to break the boundaries between the affluent suburbs and the children living in poverty in the inner city. From the outset, Deacon Joe, originally under the supervision of Father Arnold Weber, has worked to offer inner city children an opportunity to obtain a faith-based education at Ascension School in North Minneapolis.

The Joseph and Louise Wierschem Scholarship Fund offers an opportunity to break yet another boundary for these inner city children. The scholarship fund helps children attending Ascension School in North Minneapolis stay on the right track by backing their continued education at a faith-based institution once they have completed eighth grade. Currently this fund has helped six bright children full of promise attend the following schools during the 2009-2010 school year: Benilde St. Margaret's, Cristo Rey, DeLaSalle and Totino Grace. The six scholarship recipients are mostly minority children all of whom are living at or below the poverty level. Currently the scholarship committee is in the process of awarding the 2010-2011 scholarships.

## Discover the Holy

One of the amazing outcomes of Church Renewal and Reform that generated out of the Second Vatican Council of the 60's was the Universal Call to Holiness for everyone. Not just for His Holiness the Pope or His Eminence, the Archbishop or Reverend Father but for the average lay person. My mom, dad, and we nine kids on a very modest family income could also become holy. This was quite an awakening even for me in my teen years. I am not talking about piety that was often sold as holiness. We're talking real holiness now. Richard Rohr in his fabulous book that most of you have heard about and maybe even read talks about this "Holy Longing." He is in a long line of spiritual writers who tried to name the "Holy" for the average folks.

We all knew from an early age this restlessness that St. Augustine articulated so well back in the Third Century. "Our hearts are restless, until they rest in Thee, O Lord." We hunger to be close to God. We weren't sure God was close to us the way he was taught and portrayed when I was growing up as the Great Accountant up in the sky, keeping score of all our misdeeds and temputous thoughts. The way the liturgy of those times was presented clouded in mystery, a foreign language and obtuse rituals we were sure He was far away. The Sermon usually made sure that we were reminded how this all powerful God had a fiery place for most of us.

But then came this pronouncement from 2,600 Bishops gathered from all over the world in the 60's that "God was closer than you could imagine." God had a passionate love for all people and had a universal will to save everybody. Everybody? Yes, people of good will, Lutherans, Baptists, and Methodists, Jewish, Muslims, Hindu's and even those atheists. As my daughter Megan once approached me saying, "You know Dad, I don't know if I believe in God." I said, "That's okay Megan, God believes in you and He

really loves you." That gave her a moment of pause.

The Catholic Church is in a bunker mentality as of late. There seems to be a lot of pronouncements out of fear and retribution. We have a new vigilantism a foot. Let's make sure everyone is really orthodox. Let's make sure the liturgy is really sacred and a literal translation of the Latin. Enough of this familiarity. Never mind this inviting language of the vernacular, the language of the people. Let's make sure all the priests are saying and doing everything as the ritual book states. You can see some of the compulsive fetishness already surrounding the Eucharistic celebration. More is to come. Enough of this inclusive language and exuberant celebration. Let's get on our knees and ask for forgiveness. No more standing in celebration and witness to the resurrected Lord. God is now not here among us but "up there" someplace. Those 2,600 Bishops were wrong in "opening the windows of change and fresh air." Enough of this ministry by lay people doing the work of the kingdom of God. There are only certain people ordained to do that. I know this sounds overstated but the documents and formation programs coming into place are foreboding.

Furthermore, as with many other positions of authority in our culture, the trust of religious leaders and their handling of finances, sex abuse, parish realignments of faith communities, liturgical re-entrenchment is at a low ebb. With an educated lay population schooled in many fine disciplines and sacred gifts given in Baptism in a culture that demands collaboration, I see storm clouds on the horizon.

I hope you continue to discover the Holy in your life and relationships, and in an attitude of gratitude, thank God for all those great things wherever you worship.

## Catechists/Teachers Needed!

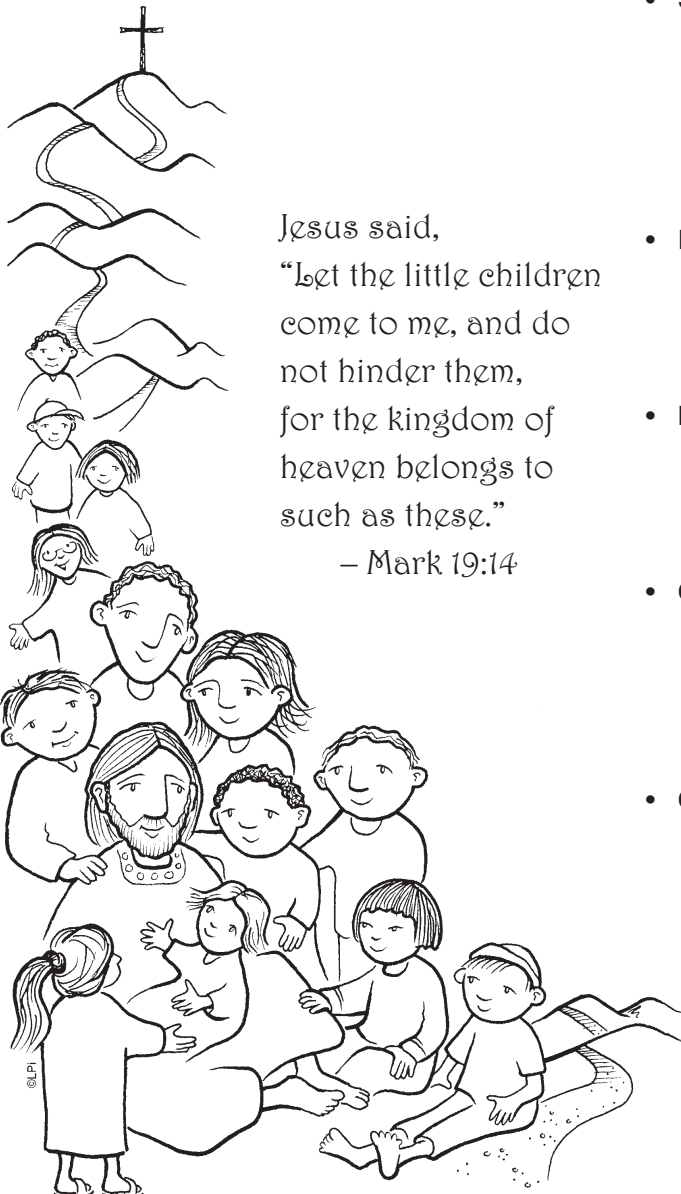

## Administry Bits

The last fiscal year ended on June 30. Contributions (as were reported in the July 11 bulletin) were down significantly. However, there were some staff reductions and other cost reductions made heading into the year and so the parish will finish the year in the black. The upcoming year will present some significant financial challenges for the parish and, as always, your prayers, time, and contributions are encouraged and appreciated.

There have been several projects in the works this summer and I thought it would be a good idea to give you an update. As you are probably aware, both priests will be living in the Rectory on campus. We had to remodel the basement to make the basement more suitable for the associate pastor (although the pastor might want the space when he sees the great work that Greg Wacek and Kevin Keenan have done there). This project will be nearly complete by mid-August. The cost of these renovations will come from past fund-raising efforts.

To accommodate the ministry activity that was once done in the basement of the Rectory, we changed the library space to an area hosting faith formation offices and resources. The Library shelves and material will be reinstalled in the Fire-side Room. These two projects should be complete by the end of August. In addition to Greg's work, a big thank you to parishioners Tony Peters and Dan Vanderheyden who did some great work to keep the cost of this project down. This project will be paid for with reserved maintenance funds.

The cemetery project is inching forward. The resident in the home has moved out and so we have greater flexibility in how we phase in the expansion. The new in-ground graves (east of the tree stand) will be available before the end of August. The new spaces for above ground cremans (colunbarium) and in-ground cremans will unfortunately not be available until late fall or more likely next spring. The costs of these projects will be paid from past grave sales.

The finance council has reviewed the long-term financial needs of the cemetery and also reviewed prices at other cemeteries. They decided that the prices will need to go up to \$900/grave. The change will go into effect October 1 (so now might be a good buying opportunity if you are planning to be buried in our cemetery).

Look for an annual report in the next month which will contain the financial activity of the parish as well as new staff bios, ministry accomplishments, and goals for the upcoming year.
