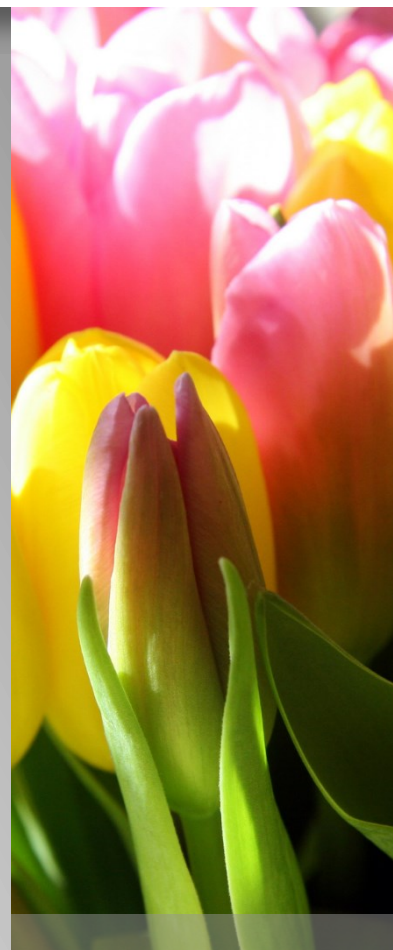

Ascension Outreach Weekend Supporting A Future Full of Hope

Holy Name of Jesus has had a long-standing relationship with Church of the Ascension and Ascension Catholic School in North Minneapolis that extends back nearly 30 years. This relationship has ebbed and flowed over time, and there is an effort underway to re-invigorate the important interconnection between our two parishes. Just as this relationship was beginning to build steam in 2020, COVID-19 put the brakes on our efforts. However, one event that has been consistently held over the past several years is our annual Ascension Outreach Weekend for Ascension Catholic School. This year's event will take place at Holy Name of Jesus during the Masses on the weekend of May 14 and 15.

Ascension Catholic School Continues to Shine

Ascension Catholic School has been an important presence in the heart of North Minneapolis for more than 125 years. Throughout its history, Ascension has served as both a reflection of its community and as an instrument for change and hope on the northside of Minneapolis, helping move lives forward through education and spiritual formation.

Currently, 93% of the 280 scholars at Ascension Catholic School are children of color, 68% qualify for free or reduced lunch, which is a marker for poverty, and 17% are learning to speak English as a second language. Many scholars enter the school two to three grade levels behind. Yet, despite these challenges, Ascension 8th graders consistently outscore their peers on standardized math and reading tests and are much better prepared to enter high school. **In fact, for the past several years, 100% of Ascension 8th graders have gone on to receive their high school diplomas, with a vast majority going on to college.** This compares well with Minneapolis Public Schools, where 62% of African American and 57% of Hispanic students graduate high school on time.

A Safe Sanctuary During Challenging Times

The past two years have been difficult for all of us, and particularly challenging for people in the neighborhoods surrounding Ascension. COVID-19 hit urban communities of color especially hard. The civil unrest and increased violence in the inner city made personal safety a priority for all Ascension scholars and staff. It's hard to imagine the difficulties each student faces in trying to focus on schoolwork while being concerned about their health and personal safety. The teachers and scholars have performed remarkably well despite these challenges. Ascension provides a safe learning environment. Staff and scholars *believe* in their ability to achieve, knowing that a strong education provides an opportunity to break the cycle of poverty.

Ascension Catholic School is a beacon of hope in the heart of North Minneapolis. Given the difficult challenges of these past two years, Ascension needs our partnership more than ever to build on their past success. **In fact, 95% of Ascension's general operating revenue is generated through sponsorships, individual donations, grant funding and second collection efforts. Roughly 4% comes from tuition and fees paid by families.**

I sang in the church choir throughout high school. Further study of the organ in high school took place with several college teachers at St. Scholastica and UW-Superior. I enrolled as a music major at UW-Superior and served as organist at the Cathedral of Christ the King during two of those college years. Following college, I was accepted as a graduate student at Notre Dame in the sacred music program.

My first job was at Nativity of Mary in Bloomington where I served as Director of Liturgy and Music for fifteen years. During the first few years of teaching, I realized how much I missed playing for church, so I found opportunities on the weekends at a number of churches including, St. Peter's in Richfield, St. Patrick's in Inver Grove Heights and St. Edward in Bloomington.

After fourteen years of teaching I returned to church ministry and became the Director of Liturgy and Music at St. Edward. A vacancy at Holy Name of Jesus and a visit from Fr. Steve back in 2014 was the invitation I needed to move one last time. Holy Name of Jesus has been a great ending to a long career of service in liturgical music and liturgy.

Over the last 38 years, I have worked with so many wonderful priests, colleagues and parishioners in many parishes. It has been a rewarding career and I will miss the joys of making music with the many wonderful cantors, choir members, musicians, school children, school music teachers and our team of music directors at HNOJ. It has been a place of growth for me spiritually, musically and professionally. I have been privileged and blessed to serve in a great community. I am looking forward to celebrating Mass in the pew, as well as time for travel and hobbies. I know that I will miss my involvement in music making so I am sure I will be on a bench somewhere in the future. Thank you Holy Name of Jesus for allowing me to serve as your Director of Music these past eight years.

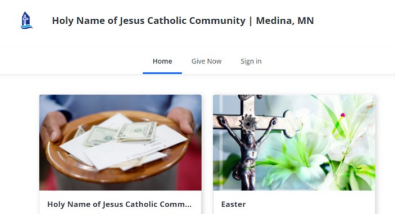

NPH A Family Affair

**"You may only be one person in the world, but you may be all the world to one child."
Father William Wasson, founder of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos**

Holy Name of Jesus parishioners have been invited to support a very unique charity for almost 30 years. Many of our teens and adults have a special place in their hearts for the children at Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH), Spanish for "Our Little Brothers and Sisters". In 1954, Father William B. Wasson, a native of Phoenix, AZ, requested custody of a boy jailed for stealing from his church in Cuernavaca, Mexico. By the end of that year, 32 impoverished boys from broken homes were in his care and NPH was born. Today, NPH supports more than 7600 children, both inside and outside of their homes in nine different Latin American and Caribbean countries.

In the 1990's, Fr. Arnold Weber and the Holy Name of Jesus community were introduced to the NPH ministry. After graciously hosting a Fiesta fundraiser in 1993, the parish started organizing service trips to Casa San Salvador in Miacatlán, Mexico. Teens and adult chaperones responded to God's call to serve by planning Bible school activities, praying for the pequeños, and raising funds for the home months before they traveled. As excitement for the trip builds each year, large suitcases are packed with donations and then personally delivered to the awaiting pequeños as the bus pulls into the home. Everyone quickly realizes upon arrival that language is only one form of communication. Love, hugs, music and prayer transcend all language barriers and the Holy Spirit faithfully fills in the gaps during the visit.

After two years of cancelled trips due to the pandemic, a group of parishioners will once again be traveling to serve God's children this Aug. 1-7. Eliut Fonseca is leading the effort and coordinating details with the NPH office. Since the home in Mexico was damaged by a 7.1-magnitude earthquake in Sept. 2017, our group will be volunteering at Casa Santa Ana in the Dominican Republic again this summer.

One fruit of the NPH ministry is that parishioners of all ages have been drawn to serve the less fortunate in many special ways. The HNOJ relationship with NPH has grown into much more than an annual mission trip. Relationships with the pequeños have become year-round friendships through sponsorships and whole families have experienced the joy and love of NPH over the years.

In 2002, Señora Ann Benson, the Spanish teacher at Holy Name of Jesus School, chaperoned her first NPH trip and has since accompanied teens nine different summers. Her three children, Meg, Liz and Peter, also volunteered multiple times in Mexico. Ann studied in Cuernavaca during college and always wanted to return. Her knowledge of the culture and language coupled with her teaching skills have enhanced many of our mission trips over the years. In 2010, the students of HNOJ School started sponsoring two pequeños as part of their Spanish classes. They regularly correspond with their long distance friends and

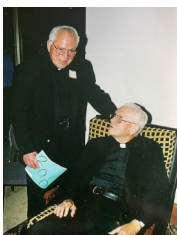
hold an annual fundraiser to support them financially. The students were blessed to meet one of the pequeños, David, in person when he performed with NPH's traveling song and dance troupe in 2017 and then again in 2019. The immediate rapport and mutual joy were exciting to watch!

The Hoover family has also supported NPH in a variety of ways. Ten years ago, Lance was just a first grader when he decided to collect gently-used school supplies at the end of the school year to send to Mexico (and Ascension School in Minneapolis). He presented his idea to Señora Benson and Principal Laurent and then made signs and announcements and organized collection bins to gather the supplies. The service project that started because of Lance's compassion for the poor and gratitude for his many blessings continues today.

Also, Lance's dad, Dave, and his sister, Julia, were part of the 2018 trip roster. Julia planned a Theater Camp fundraiser and feels that "the NPH mission trip is a great opportunity to get outside of yourself and serve. Not only do you have the chance to connect with people who come from a very different background, but you learn a lot about yourself and about the Lord. You learn how the Lord is trustworthy and will provide for you as you're pushed out of your comfort zone and find that service is truly key to joy!!" Dave served as a parent chaperone in the Dominican Republic, and, reflecting on his experience said, "my faith was inspired to really consider how God calls us to love our neighbor. (We) got the opportunity to learn that our neighbor can be a different color, with a different economic reality and a family life that is foreign to me. Christ gave us that opportunity to love our pequeño neighbors and my faith was deepened when they unconditionally loved us right back!"

The Kostelc family has also made NPH a family affair. Since 2003 when Chris became the staff trip organizer, he has connected our teens with the NPH story and invited them to deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ as they serve. He has witnessed many parishioners be fundamentally transformed by their immersion experience at the NPH homes and sees the trip as a "tremendous opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in the poor and to learn in an experiential way that human dignity is not wrapped up in how useful someone is or someone's financial worth." Chris' wife, Liz, helped organize a parish-wide Fiesta fundraiser in 2011 and now their high school daughter, Ella, is traveling to the DR this August. Chris and Liz are excited to have Ella live with the pequeños and experience the culture of the home firsthand.

So the love for NPH has rippled through our parish families for decades. Please see page seven for our upcoming fundraisers!

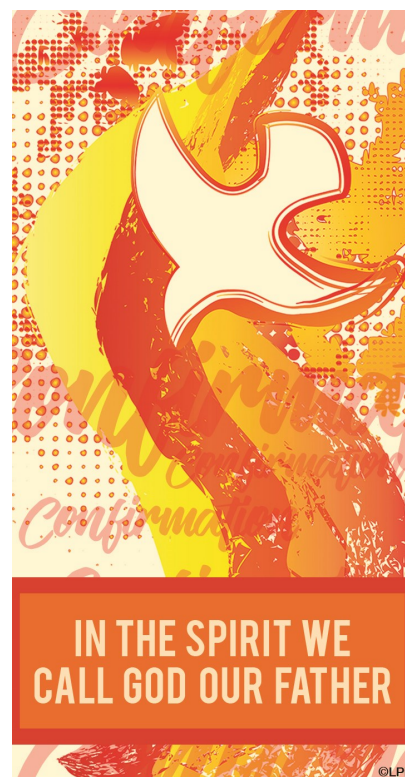
