A Praiseworthy Offering By Fr. Tim Wratkowski, Pastor

Do you know someone who is good at giving meaningful gifts to others? My brother is a lot like that. He notices the needs of others and responds in a thoughtful manner. One year for my birthday, he gave me special camping candles that would not blow out in the wind - perfect for celebrating Mass outdoors. It was such a relief to finally get through Mass without relighting candles over and over!

A meaningful gift shows our awareness of another's need and becomes a sign of love. This is why, in our faith, it matters how we use our time, talents, and treasure, they reveal who and what we love. In our Faith, we call this stewardship: recognizing that everything we have, even life itself, is a gift from God. We are not owners but caretakers, entrusted with these gifts to glorify God and serve others.

For our communal reflection on the call to stewardship, our theme this year is: A Praiseworthy Offering. What makes an offering "praiseworthy"? This phrase recalls a verse from the Letter to Hebrews: "Let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God." What makes an offering "praiseworthy" is that we sacrifice something to God in praise and thanks of Him.

The irony is that God doesn't need anything from us, not even camping candles that resist the wind. But offering a gift in sacrifice is something we need to do for Him. What makes our gift meaningful is not the amount of money, time, or service, but that it first means something to us. When we give what we value, even when it costs us, that is love. Love gives without expecting anything in return.

Jesus himself shows us this love and becomes the perfect example of stewardship. He gave himself without reserve, not only on the Cross, but in the daily offering of His whole life. In doing so, He revealed the heart of the Father, who gave what was most precious to Him: His only begotten Son. God shows us that whenever we make a praiseworthy offering, no matter how small or great, His divine life is shared with us in return.

During our fall stewardship invitation month beginning Oct. 4-5, I invite you to prayerfully consider how you can make A Praiseworthy Offering for our parish family. We need your prayers - at Mass and in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. We need your time and presence in the ministries that bring life to our parish: liturgy, youth faith formation, our school, pastoral care, and outreach. And with rising costs of insurance, utilities, maintenance, and fair wages for our staff, we also rely on your financial support. Thanks to your generosity, many improvements have already been made, yet important work still lies ahead, including a campus master plan and the development of a new columbarium. With these needs before us, if your circumstances allow, I invite you to prayerfully consider a 7% increase in giving in 2026.

As we respond to this call together, may the Lord see in our offerings a true expression of love for Him. I am deeply grateful for your prayers, trust, and support, especially over this past year. May the Lord guide our prayerful discernment as we look upon the needs of His Church and respond in generosity.

Building Community

We are truly blessed with a vibrant and growing community. From 2024 to 2025, our parish grew by 5%, now spiritual home to 2,620 households and 9,223 members. Rooted in St. Benedict's wisdom, "Welcome all as you would welcome Christ," we continue this tradition through our Big Small Dinner for new members, the neighborhood Food Truck Social, our Fall Festival, and the many parish events that bring us together throughout the year.

Thanks to your support, our ministries continue to grow and enrich parish life. With a very generous donation, we were able to add a beautiful school library. And with prudent cost management resulting in an \$209,407 operating surplus, we renovated the parish bathrooms in the cafeteria.

- Useful Items (sewing kits, drawstring bags, toothbrushes/toothpaste, bar soap, combs/brushes, manicure kits)




Men's Night, Oct. 23


Science and Religion, Save the Date


