Ascension Parish has been an important presence in the heart of North Minneapolis for nearly 125 years. Throughout its history, Ascension Catholic School has served as both a reflection of its community and as an instrument for change on the North Side of Minneapolis, helping move lives forward through education and spiritual formation.

Currently, 96% of the 298 scholars at Ascension Catholic School are children of color, 75% qualify for free or reduced lunch, which is a marker for poverty,

and 14% are learning to speak English as a second language. Yet, despite these challenges, Ascension 8th graders consistently outscore their peers within the public school system on standardized math and reading tests and are much better prepared to enter high

school. In fact, 100% of the Ascension 8th graders from 2016 received their high school diplomas in 2020.

Impact Of The Pandemic And Civil Unrest

2020 was a difficult year for all of us, and particularly challenging for people in the neighborhoods surrounding Ascension. COVID-19 hit urban communities of color especially hard, and the civil unrest last summer following the death of George Floyd made personal safety a priority for all Ascension scholars and staff. The school made an intentional pivot to distance learning, with a mission of "Every Child, Every Day" to ensure that, despite the lack of in-person contact, the total needs of each scholar were being met. This included access to technology, food security (meals for the scholars), and other needs. It is hard to imagine the difficulties each student faces in trying to focus on schoolwork while being concerned about their health, personal safety and lack of social interaction. The teachers and scholars performed remarkably well under a less-than-ideal learning atmosphere. Most scholars are now back in classrooms, and they are all looking forward to returning to a more "normal" educational environment in the 2021-22 school year.

Happy Spring! Happy Easter!



Did you know that the meaning of the word Easter in some languages is associated with the word spring. Spring, of course, is the season in which we see new growth. Spring is the season in which the amount of daylight now exceeds the

amount of darkness each day. Both lead to new life.

What natural life sees and celebrates, so does spiritual life. We have new life in the persons of our newest members of the Body of Christ. This year, we had a group of ten people who made the decision to join in full communion with the Catholic Church. If you were at the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday night, you heard them say, "I believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches and proclaims to be revealed by God."

In saying this, they were professing all that we say in the Creed each week at Mass. They were acknowledging the truth of Sacred Scriptures and Holy (Apostolic) Tradition - what we call the deposit of faith. They were professing adherence to the Magisterium or teaching office of the

Church (the Pope united with his brother Bishops). This Magisterium is entrusted with the deposit of faith and serves in guarding, uniting and governing it as well as all that adhere to it - us (see Eucharistic Prayer I).

They have been called to follow Christ in His Body, the Church, as members of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, as have we. They are new life in our very midst, new life which gives us hope. They are a light to us, helping us to see the beauty, truth and goodness of the Catholic faith. They are a great sign in our midst of how Jesus calls and we are to respond.

It may have been a leap of faith for them or simply the next step in living a life hearing God in their hearts. Whether leap or step, they are an inspiration and a wake-up call to all of us who may tend to take our faith for granted.

Thank you to them and to their sponsors for being a light to us. As we enjoy the longer days and new growth in our yards and gardens, let's enjoy, all the days of our lives, the new growth in our Church community as well as a renewed growth in our hearts.

Adoration is Returning to the Chapel

Since we came back from lockdown last summer, we have been having Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in both the main church and the Adoration chapel. If you have never experienced Adoration before, it is a form of prayer that involves taking a consecrated Host from Mass and placing it on the altar in a gold vessel called a *monstrance*. It is a powerful way to remain in loving communion with Jesus even long after Mass has ended!

Having Adoration in our church these past several months was a blessing in so many ways. Now as life at HNOJ returns to normalcy and other events look to use the church space, we will return to having Adoration almost exclusively in the Adoration Chapel, beginning on May 3. The schedule will remain the same. Since we are still following social distancing protocols, we ask you to be attentive to the 6-person capacity in the chapel. However, since most hours have only one or two adorers, there shouldn't be any issue for you to come and adore Our Lord at these times!

**Adoration on Tuesday evenings from 7-9 pm will remain in the main church as an opportunity for more people to participate. Please come and bring your family and friends, even if you can stay for only a few minutes!

Vacation Bible School is a four-day, faith filled AND funfilled week for children ages four through those entering fifth grade in the fall of 2021. Children who will be four in the fall and are potty trained are also eligible to register at the preschool level. The cost is \$45 per child. Our registration deadline is July 2, 2021. Any registrations received after July 2 will be assessed a \$5 late fee. Don't delay - VBS is the best week of the summer!

Those who have applied will be contacted via email within a week of receiving the application to inform them if their application has been accepted.
