Called to Belong

Dear Members of Holy Name of Jesus,

As the transition to succeed Fr. Steve began this July, I was led naturally to reflect on how grateful I was for the way I have been received by this parish community the last two years. Alongside Fr. Mike, I am excited for the opportunity to serve you. We hope that you will experience the Lord's blessing through our administering of the Sacraments, sharing life with you and sharing our gifts with you.

In 1 Corinthians 12:12-31, Saint Paul reflects on the reality that each of us has been baptized into the life of Jesus. Paul says, "You are the body of Christ and individually members of it." Jesus invites each of us to live as His Body here at Holy Name of Jesus. Just as a natural human body has individual parts with different functions, so too does Christ's spiritual body. We are individually called to manifest the life of Christ, whether it is participation in liturgy, Sacraments, Adoration, Faith Formation activities, school or outreach. The sharing of our diverse gifts and talents is *essential* for the healthy functioning of the Body of Christ within Holy Name of Jesus. In our parish mission statement, we are reminded:

You are truly Called to Belong through prayer, participation and generosity. **Your response to the stewardship invitation will help our parish plan and have the resources necessary to be flexible and responsive to the needs of our community.** The health of our parish community depends on your willingness to share the gifts for which you have been so richly blessed.

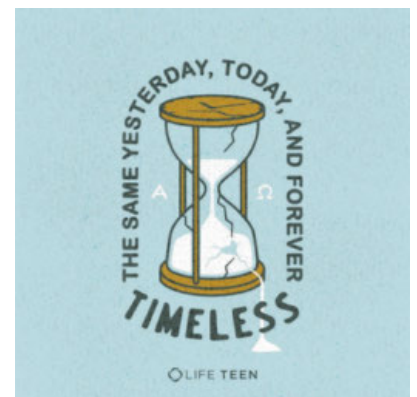

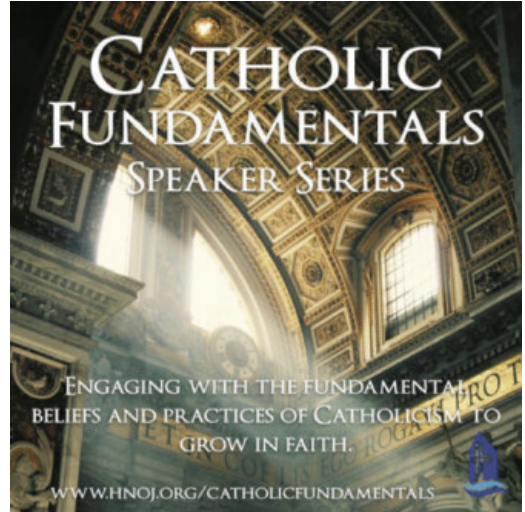
