To The Parents: Intro to Confirmation

When you brought your child to the Church for Baptism, you accepted the sacred responsibility and privilege of "training them in the practice of the faith." (Rite of Baptism, 30). You were reminded that you are the first and best teachers of your child and you were entrusted with keeping the light of faith burning brightly in their life. Parents instruct their children, both by what they say and <u>what they do</u>. It is now time for that next step. Confirmation is a celebration of the ongoing power of the already-present Holy Spirit in our lives, the Spirit first received in Baptism. Through this sacrament, the gifts of the Holy Spirit are deepened and intensified.

Following are some suggestions on ways to assist your young person in their preparation:

- 1. Pray for and with your young person everyday.
- 2. Initiate conversation about the Sacrament of Confirmation, share your memories of receiving the sacrament, and encourage them to share their ideas of how receiving this sacrament will change their faith life.
- 3. Help with the selection of a sponsor and saint's name for Confirmation.
- 4. Make sure all documents are completed and returned in a timely manner.

Guidelines for reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation:

- 1. Regular participation in Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass.
- 2. An appropriate understanding of the Catholic Christian life. The candidate should understand and reflect the life of Christ in their lifestyle.
- 3. A firm determination to live the Christian life to the best of their ability. The candidate must be a good steward, giving in Christian proportion of their time, talent, and treasure.
- 4. The candidate must understand the importance of personal and communal worship in the life of the Church.
- 5. Faithful participation in the Confirmation preparation program, scheduled classes, retreats, etc.
- Commitment to further religious education by the candidate and parents or guardian. <u>Reception of this sacrament is a beginning – not an end.</u> It is one step in our life-long journey to holiness. The candidate must be willing to be actively involved in parish life after Confirmation.



Holy Name of Jesus Faith Community will assist in the faith formation of the Confirmation candidates by:

- 1. Scheduling class sessions during which the candidates will delve deeper into understanding their faith, the scriptures, and the Sacrament of Confirmation. Sessions will be held on the campus of Holy Name of Jesus.
- Inviting speakers from the local faith community, greater Twin Cities' area to share their insights with the candidates. The small groups will be led by volunteers from HNOJ under the direction of the Senior High Youth Minister. It is important that the candidates attend all sessions so as not to miss the information shared at these sessions. (the attendance policy can be found on page #16)
- 3. Priests will attend and/or participate in some of the sessions with the candidates.

Expectations

Regular participation in the Sunday liturgy:

Sunday Mass is not optional for Catholics. Celebration of the Eucharist is our highest form of worship and candidates are expected to be active participants. This is the faith they will affirm.

Participations in Sessions

- 1. Candidate should be <u>Respectful</u> and attentive to speakers, fellow small group members and others in attendance.
- 2. Candidate should <u>Invest</u> in each session in order to get as much out of it as possible, and complete any assignments including meeting with their sponsor, saint's report, service requirements, interviews with small group leaders, and retreats.
- 3. Candidate should actively <u>Participate</u> in small group discussions and take part in the scheduled retreats.

Phone Policy During Sessions

Students are allowed to bring their phones to all sessions, but the expectation is they will be on silent or turned off and not used until session is complete. Those who fail to uphold this policy are subject to leaders taking their phones until the end of the night.



Sponsor

Choosing a Sponsor:

If you have ever attended a Confirmation Liturgy, you have seen an adult who stands behind the candidate with a hand on their shoulder as they are anointed, but the role of a sponsor goes far beyond a simple gesture of support. Did you know that the word sponsor comes from the same root word as "responsible"? A Confirmation sponsor is someone whom you look up to as a role model in faith and will be there to support you spiritually before, during and after you receive the sacrament. In essence, your sponsor is meant to act as a spiritual guide and friend in your faith.

That being said, choosing your sponsor is an important task. Don't just choose someone because they are fun or because they haven't done it yet. Choose your sponsor because you know that they will help you grow in your faith this year and because they will continue to support you.

Here are some good questions to consider when choosing your sponsor:

- Who in my life has made an impact on my faith?
- Is this person responsible?
- Is this person mature?
- Does he/she practice his/her Catholic faith actively by attending Mass at least weekly?
- Does he/she practice his/her Catholic faith actively in the way that he/she lives and acts?
- Do I trust him/her?

The Archdiocese of St. Paul-Minneapolis has specific requirements that are to be met by all sponsors:

1. The sponsor must be an active, participating Catholic who has been confirmed; someone who will be an inspiration and support for the candidate. There is to be one sponsor, male or female.

2. Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.

3. He or she may not be the candidate's mother or father. It is desirable, but not mandatory, that the baptismal sponsor (godparent) also be the sponsor at Confirmation to show the close



connection of the two sacraments. In many cases this is not possible and another suitable person may be selected. A parent may be proxy at the ceremony.

4. The sponsor should be a person who is prayerful, open, dependable, loving and is comfortable sharing his or her faith with young people.

5. The sponsor should be someone who is a witness to Christ and to the importance of a Catholic Christian lifestyle by their words and actions. A person who will be a support and example to the candidate as he/she moves through periods of crisis, questioning, and discernment.

Sponsor Information

To complete required confirmation sponsor information, please have your sponsor visit: <u>hnoj.org/crewconfirmation</u> (the form will be on the left side)

Please have your sponsor complete the online form no later than **December 1st, 2019**.

In this program, the following is asked of the sponsor:

1. Accompany the candidate to the designated Confirmation prep meetings on 1/22 & 4/22 from 7:30-8:30 p.m.)

2. Attend the Liturgy of Confirmation (May 10, 1:30 p.m. Basilica of St. Mary, Minneapolis).

- 3. Present the candidate during the Confirmation Rite.
- 4. Meet with the candidate regularly throughout this year of preparation and discuss the topics addressed in the preparation sessions.
- 5. Share their faith story with his or her candidate.
- 6. Pray for and with the candidate.
- 7. Continue to be there for the candidate and lend spiritual support after the Liturgy of Confirmation is over.



Saint Report

Saint Reports are due no later than April 1st, 2020.

Background:

So many times when we think of saints the first thing we think of is a halo, but the truth is that saints can't be reduced to people who walked around the earth with heads that glowed. No! Saints were ordinary people, like you and I, that lived extraordinary lives. The Church says that a saint is someone who possessed "heroic virtue" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #828). Each candidate will be asked to take on the name of one of the saints at Confirmation. The name choose should be one whose life will be a model and inspiration for them during their life as a Catholic. The Saint name that is chosen should express something of the candidate's innerself, an ideal or goal they are setting for themselves as a Catholic, and should be a reflection of their resolve to live as a disciple of Christ. The name will be the name by which they are addressed by the Archbishop at the Confirmation ceremony.

The following are requirements for this report:

- Submit report by emailing it to: **Confirmation@hnoj.org**
- Save file as: "LastName.FirstName.SaintReport"
 - (ex. Ashley.Cermak.SaintReport)
- Must be typed, written in your own words, and be 1-2 pages double spaced in size 12 "Times New Roman" font.
- What should go in your Saint Report
 - Brief History of your saint
 - What are the dates of birth and death?
 - Where was the saint from
 - Where did they do their work?
 - \circ $\,$ Why they are a saint
 - What are some major/important events in the life of this saint?
 - What makes this person so holy?
 - Why did you choose this saint?
 - How do you relate to this saint?
 - What qualities did this saint possess that you admire?
 - What special aspects of the saint's life would you like to use as an example in your own faith life?

Letter of Intent

Letters of Intent are due no later than April 1st, 2020.

Background:

"Letter of Intent" is just a fancy way of saying: tell us in writing why you want to be confirmed. Please take time to compose this statement carefully. Not only does it give us a chance to understand what you have gained in your formation, but also allows you to process what you have learned and how you have grown as well as what you desire to receive from this sacrament. Please be honest and thoughtful. This will be given to Father Steve to read and may be sent to the Archbishop prior to Confirmation.

The statement must be:

- Submit Letter of Intent by emailing it to: Confirmation@hnoj.org
- Save file as: "LastName.FirstName.Intent"
 - o (ex. Ashley.Cermak.Intent)
- Letter of Intent Guidelines
 - Must be typed
 - Written in your own words
 - Address the letter to Fr. Steve Ulrick
 - No less than 1 page double spaced
 - Size 12 "Times New Roman" font
- Please touch on all of the following points in your statement:
 - Why do you think you are ready to receive this sacrament?
 - Explain one aspect of the faith that became clearer to you through this process, and tell why you believe it is an important aspect of our faith.
 - Explain how you plan to continue being an active member of the Church after Confirmation.

Retreats

Retreats are wonderful opportunities to step away from life's busyness and spend time reflecting more deeply on one's relationship with God. They are meant to draw youth into a closer relationship with God and into a closer relationship with other persons from our parish community. One of our primary goals is to connect the youth to their local faith community, Holy Name of Jesus, and provide awesome retreat experiences.

Each Confirmation Candidate is required to experience at least two parish based retreats or a Confirmation specific retreat during the two year preparation for Confirmation. **If none of the retreat experiences below work for your son or daughter, please contact Ashley Cermak as soon as possible.*

**While teen core team members are expected to attend the teen core team retreat each year they are on core team, this retreat counts for 1 out of 2 required retreats for Confirmation. Teen core team members must participate in one other retreat experience over the course of years 1 & 2 confirmation preparation.



Retreat Phone Policy

Yes, in the past we have not consistently enforced the rule of no cell phones. **This year we absolutely will.** If adult leaders see or hear that you are on your cellphones while on retreat, we will take them away for the remainder of the retreat. This includes bus rides, free time, and bed time. Why? To help teens be fully present to each other and the way God is working in their heart. We know it's hard to disconnect, but have seen the how the retreat experience is much more powerful without the distraction of phones. We know sometimes teens and parents like to stay in contact while away on retreat, we are asking teens and parents alike to please resist this temptation in order for you to be fully open to what God wants to do. Parents, please feel free to contact Ashley Cermak if you must get a hold of your teen. Teens, be assured that if there be any kind of emergency, you will be able to use a leaders phone. Be at peace. Leave the phone at home. It will be hard, but you absolutely will not regret it.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Confirmation? Confirmation is a Sacrament that strengthens us and obliges us to witness to, spread and defend the faith (CCC 1303). Confirmation is not graduation from a life of Christian learning, a mere cultural passage into maturity or an opportunity to choose whether or not to remain Catholic. Confirmation completes our full initiation as Catholic Christians (CCC 1306) and strengthens our ability to be missionary disciples through the reception of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

What do the specific Confirmation preparation sessions look like? There will be five Confirmation sessions that explore topics specifically related to preparing for the night of Confirmation, when the Holy Spirit will seal the candidate with the gift of the presence of God. These sessions are an important opportunity for the candidate to continue to develop their relationship with God. These sessions take place throughout late winter and early spring as the Confirmation date approaches. The dates of these sessions are included (see page #8 & #10)

When does Confirmation preparation begin? When does it end? How long does it take? Most teens will begin completing the pre-requisites for Confirmation preparation immediately following their 8th-grade year. Many will choose to complete the process over a two-year period, be Confirmed in their 10th-grade year and continue to be involved in youth ministry in their 11th and 12th-grade years. Some students may choose to complete their preparation over their four years of high school.

Why is there such a strong emphasis on retreats? Retreats are one of the most critical components of Confirmation preparation through HNOJ. Life can be a little crazy. Rarely do we take the time we need to get away from it all. Retreat experiences with HNOJ CREW are exactly that, opportunities to take a break, relax, think, talk and pray about who we are, why we are here and what our faith in Jesus has to do with it all. Retreats with the HNOJ CREW provide the environment for young people to have a personal and transformational encounter with Jesus Christ.

What is the Confirmation preparation interview? It is a lot less scary than it sounds. Think of it more as a conversation than a test. The youth ministry team at HNOJ wants to hear about your experience of Confirmation preparation, your relationship with God, and how you plan to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ following Confirmation.



Attendance

We expect teens to be at all required sessions (for their track) for the entirety of the session. We do however understand things beyond your control come up. In cases of unpredictable circumstances teens may miss one small group gathering, up to two First Sundays, and one confirmation prep meeting.

Emergency absence considerations:

Extreme circumstances, including death of family member, severe sickness and/or inclement weather will be considered emergency absences and candidates may be excused from the minimum requirements. These extenuating situations will be evaluated on a case by case basis. If you feel as though any of your absences fall into this category, please call the Senior High Youth Minister to discuss options.

Weather Policy

If the weather is severe and we decide to cancel any sessions, you will receive an email from the Senior High Youth Minister. In addition, the cancellation of classes will be posted on <u>www.hnoj.org</u> in the newsbox section of the front page, on HNOJ social media, and will be broadcast over: WCCO radio station (830) and KARE 11 (channel 11).

We will defer to your judgment as to whether or not it is safe for you to travel. If a session is missed due to weather conditions, it is the responsibility of the parent to see that the child(ren) have completed any assignments that may be due and have their child turn those forms into the small group leaders at the next session.
