As I reflect on the past year and the upcoming year ahead of us, I am reminded once again of our vision statement:

Sharing in the Body of Christ, we seek to Know the heart of Christ, See the face of Christ, and Be the hands of Christ.

Last year was a great year of discipleship despite the challenges of returning from COVID. I am always delighted to see you back in the building. Whether it is participation in liturgy, sacraments, Adoration, Faith Formation activities, school or outreach, Holy Name of Jesus parishioners are truly the Hands of Christ.

This past year we had over 200 people engage in Synod small groups which will continue to be a focus area as we move into 2023. Our school has grown to capacity, and our outreach efforts have surpassed previous years. Mass counts are rising, and I'm hopeful we will continue to fill the pews.

Financially, Fiscal Year 2022 had a slight increase in giving, some generous special donations, a very successful Fall Festival and increased admission at the school. Expenses, however, continue to rise as we face the current fiscal realities. The Finance Council has approved a plan to fund deferred maintenance over the next five years, and we have set aside reserves as we face the economic challenges that may be on the horizon in the approaching year.

You have probably noticed our focus on "Being the Hands of Christ" in the past several weeks. Through your stewardship of prayer, participation and generosity, you will be given an opportunity to make a commitment to Be the Hands of Christ. I encourage 100% of households to respond to our stewardship invitation weekend Oct. 8-9. Many of our ministries need volunteers to re-engage in our important work. In addition, as costs have been rising in all areas, expenses are projected to increase by 9% compared to the prior year. Your stewardship through prayer, participation and generosity is so important to our community.

Thank you for all you do to support the mission of Holy Name of Jesus. May the Lord Jesus continue to bless you and keep you close to His heart.
