

Our Church

In ancient times, a disciple was a student or learner who chose a particular rabbi or teacher upon which to model their life. Jesus was such a teacher and gathered His disciples to form the foundation of His Church. Today, in the 21st Century, Jesus is both Savior and Teacher. - Liturgy and Prayer: Average Mass attendance has increased by over 75 during the last ministry year, as more than 1,995 now attend our Masses each weekend. Over 723 parishioners are involved in our liturgical ministries.
- Growing in Faith: In addition to the 1,004 children and youth who participate in our Faith Formation program, more than 500 adults are engaged in growing in discipleship through small groups, programs and retreats. Jesus is alive in our hearts and our community!
- Service: Thank you to over 1,200 volunteers of all ages who serve in Holy Name of Jesus' 70+ ministries.

Financial Notes & Highlights:

- Sunday giving has remained flat. A special gift this year allowed us to maintain our budget. Since 2013, our Sunday giving (excluding special gifts) has decreased by 2%.
- Electronic giving has become more popular and has increased 14% over last year.
- Due to cost reductions, our expenses were 2% less than last year.
- We reduced expenses even further in June 2017 by more than \$200,000 through staff reductions and attrition in both church and school.
- K-6 school enrollment declined by 40 students from last year. However, we added 5-day and all-day PreK for 2017-18 to bring more children into the school at an earlier age.
- We have 31 new families in the school this fall (2017-18).
- School tuition increased to \$4,850.
- Prior year deficits and capital repairs have been funded through operating reserves, such that we have utilized \$600,000 in reserves since 2013.
- Our priorities for 2018 will be to increase stewardship, control expenses and replenish our cash reserves to mitigate future downturns and provide for capital repairs.

We have engaged an experienced firm to help us increase our weekly contributions and begun a long-term stewardship plan to engage the younger generation. We are in the early stages of planning to address our future capital repair and replacement needs.

Our vision for the future is that, individually and together, we will seek to model our lives after the example of Jesus. As modern-day disciples, we want to make Jesus the foundation of our church and our family so that all we say and do is rooted in the love of Christ. Jesus: our Church, our Family, our Future.
