

2018 – A New Year, A New Look for HNOJ

We are very excited to announce that Holy Name of Jesus has a new logo and new color theme. Starting Jan. 1, 2018, with this newsletter, all of HNOJ's digital and print communications are sporting a refreshed look. Determining the need to update the logo and the subsequent process has been a yearlong endeavor by the communications committee and a group of HNOJ staff.

Why did we change the logo?

Good question. Let me take you through a short exercise that sums up this process.

If I were talking with you and your family in person right now I would ask you:

In one word, how would you describe Holy Name of Jesus to a friend who has not attended HNOJ?

Take a moment now to think of this word.... 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1... ready? When you are ready continue reading.

Was one of your words listed in the next column? These words are how dozens of people have commonly described HNOJ to me - in one word - over the last year.



Does this branding represent who HNOJ is today? Refer back to your word, and the words above. When several groups of parishioners, of all ages, were asked this same question, and they all strongly agreed that the current branding does not accurately represent HNOJ today. One person even said of our current logo and colors "low key, taking it easy." Holy Name of Jesus is the sum of all of you - the parishioners - who are an energetic,

welcoming and supportive community. Our publications should reflect who we are in our marketing and communications.

About HNOJ's New Logo and Color Palette

Holy Name of Jesus worked with a local company,

Fuzzy Duck, to design the new logo. Do you recognize the shape of the logo? The iconic cross tower is at the entrance to our church. This part of the image is immediately recognizable to anyone driving up to the building. The cross



quickly communicates that we follow Jesus.

The waves under the image are fluid and versatile, allowing it to support the mission and vision of Holy Name of Jesus, as well as the goals of many ministries. To someone who lives in the area, the waves might represent the familiar water of Holy Name Lake. Water also symbolizes the Sacrament of Baptism. The waves also represent the flowing of the Holy Spirit into and through us.

The vibrant blue color often invokes a relaxed mood, but also is welcoming and open. However, the logo looks very nice in black and white as well. We can also change the color for specific advertising, such as to gold and orange for Fall Festival, purple for lent, etc. But for everyday communications and advertising, it would stay the two-toned blue.

The colors intentionally coordinate with the schools branding. During the decision making process, people often were drawn to the school colors. Synchronized colors will benefit joint advertising materials.



Frequently asked questions:

How often do we change our logo? Looking at the bulletin archives, the bulletins in 1989 used a drawn image of the building on the cover. In 1998 it looks like a basic cross became the common

design on the return address only. The previous logo shape appears in 2006, with digital files showing a date of 2005; including the Know See Be image for the vision statement.

Will the mission and vision change?

The mission and vision of HNOJ will not change. It was felt that the mission and vision are still at the

core of what we do at Holy Name of Jesus.

Will the school logo/branding change?

The school colors were attractive to many people in the process. The new parish branding colors emulate or coordinate well with the current school branding pallet. This will make it much easier to coordinate mutual advertising. Changing the school logo is not off the table, we just wanted to take some more time to review the options.

Other ministry logo's may also get a refresh throughout the year, for example we are looking at the Fall Festival logo.

Will the exterior signage change?

HNOJ is currently taking bids to determine the cost and scope of replacing the outside signs. Some ideas that have been put on the table include an electronic sign that would replace the need for vinyl banners at the entrance. However, there is no money currently budgeted for this expense.

More Than Tasty, Cinnamon Rolls Help New Families

Sunday, Jan. 22, marks the 45th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision in the case of Roe vs Wade. In this momentous ruling, abortion in the US became legal! This decision regarding the unborn has been a controversial topic for many years. Here at Holy Name of Jesus we have been remembering this unfortunate decision with a Pro-Life fund raising event on a weekend close to Jan. 22. It began with a pancake breakfast for a few years. In January of 1991, Lee Ann Silver became the president of the Holv Name of Jesus Pro-Life group. Today it is called ACCL, A Community Caring for Life! Lee Ann asked her husband, Tom, if he would lead a group of men in putting on the annual fund raiser. As it was already in early January, Tom asked Father Arnold Weber if we could possibly skip the pancake breakfast or do some other type of fund raiser. Fr. Arnold told Tom, "I don't care what you do, but you are going to do something!"

Tom sought out the help of his friend Jeff Van Beusekom to co-chair this event and together they decided that a cinnamon roll bake and sale along with a raffle could be done given the short deadline. Jeff & Tom were able to procure the pre-made frozen cinnamon rolls, frosting and packaging supplies along with raffle prizes in time to do the fundraiser. They chose a very aggressive number of 400 dozen rolls. With the help of many men of the parish, they were able to bake, package and sell all the rolls and held the raffle too! A total success with the Blessings and the Grace of God! This was the start of the annual event that we will again hold this weekend for the 28th year.

Jeff moved to Tennessee three years later and the decision was made to drop the raffle. Tom has continued to chair this event with the help of many, many volunteers. The men helped for a number of years but now this event is being supported by many others in the parish, namely confirmation students, parents, K of C members and other volunteers who support Pro-Life causes.

Over the years, this fundraiser event has raised over \$100,000 with all the proceeds being donated to Pro-Life organizations such as: North Side Life Care Center, Pro-Life Minnesota, Birthright and Minnesota Citizens Concerned for Life.

Holy Name of Jesus has a long association with a number of Pro-Life groups that are supported by the proceeds of the cinnamon roll sale. Many members of our faith community have volunteered Tom Silver and Karen Karn at local pregnancy care centers Birthright, Northside Life Care and Southwest Options for Women, serving women in need who are unexpectedly pregnant. The Archdiocesan Life Fund and Cradle of Hope Maternity Fund give last

-chance financial assistance to pregnant women or new families with medical expenses or housing crises that they cannot handle. MCCL and Prolife Across America educate the public about life issues and keep us all apprised of legislative issues that concern respect for human life. And Prolife Action Ministries pray at abortion centers, trying to offer women seeking abortions a last-minute chance to choose life instead. All of these nonprofit organizations depend on contributions from the faithful to achieve their mission; your purchase of cinnamon rolls makes their work possible.

The official symbol of Pro-Life is the red rose. If you choose to come into the Good Samaritan Center this weekend and enjoy a cinnamon roll, you will see a red rose on each table. Many parishioners have told Tom that when they see and smell the cinnamon rolls at Holy Name of Jesus, they automatically think of Pro-Life! Maybe the cinnamon roll has become the new Pro-Life symbol.

Thank you to the parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus for supporting this very wonderful cause.

Service

Holy Name Against Hunger A Community Service Project Jan. 31, 2018

On Jan. 31, Holy Name of Jesus will host a food-packing event in the gym. Impact Lives, a humanitarian food-aid organization, will facilitate this event. HNOJ School students will pack food during the school day. HNOJ parishioners and families are invited to pack food in 45-minute shifts from 4 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. in the evening. This is the eighth year we are gathering as a community to pack food for starving families and children.

The goal of this service project is to help build awareness around those who have a greater need than us, and also to give our entire community an opportunity to work together through assembling and packing food.

Parishioners interested in participating in an evening packing shift need to sign up for the packing shift of their choice online. Please visit hnoj.org/hnah to sign up for a packing shift.

We are gathering donations to help offset the cost of the food we will pack and ship. We suggest that families signing up for a packing shift donate \$50 to this event. Individuals are encouraged to donate \$25.

Nursery Availability: We will have the Nursery open for the *first two shifts* of our food-packing event. If you have children under the age of five, we recommend signing up for either the 4 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. shift or the 5 p.m. to 5:45 p.m. shift. Please contact Theresa Reichert at 763-745-3483 or via email at treichert@hnoj.org and let her know that you need space reserved in the nursery for your younger child(ren). The younger children can play in a safe area while you and your older children experience the food-packing event together.

Wednesday Fine Dining will be open in the Good Samaritan Center from 5:15 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. Once again, we will serve the same rice that we are packing for our poorer brothers and sisters. Stop by Fine Dining to taste what we are sending to third world countries!

We are also seeking adults (ages 20 and up) to serve at this event as **Core Volunteers**. Core Volunteers need to be at HNOJ from **3:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.** on Jan. 31

Responsibilities of a Core Volunteer include:

- Provide packing volunteers an orientation to their iobs
- · Help to direct, encourage and cheer on volunteers
- Provide oversight to one packing station (up to 10 volunteers)
- Help to replenish supplies for your packing cell as they run low

Globally, one in six people do not have sufficient food.







Every day 18,000 children die of starvation. Every box of food we pack at this event will feed 216 people; or a family of six for more than a month.

Genesis Retreat for 6th-8th Graders!

Genesis is a two-day retreat for 6th, 7th and 8th grade teens put on by dedicated, well-trained, high school teens. This year's Genesis retreat will be held at Holy Name of Jesus Feb. 23-24, 2018. This is the fourth year of having this retreat opportunity at Holy Name of Jesus. The goal of this retreat is to empower middle school teens to live as disciples of Jesus Christ today. How? No gimmicks, real faith sharing, fun talks, great small groups, authentic relationships, and an entire weekend for and with other middle school teens.

Why This Retreat?

Genesis provides another retreat experience for our youth to come to more fully enter into a relationship with the Lord and each other. The longer we, as a parish, have with each junior high teen, the more we can know each one of them individually. By having the retreat here in our community, it offers our junior high teens the opportunity to form lasting and transformative relationships with adults and high school teens from our community. Luke 18 this past fall prepared many of our youth in grades 7-12 to receive God's Love more fully in their lives. Retreats are an extremely powerful time in our relationship with the Lord. We desire to offer a retreat experience that includes our 6th graders as they approach their junior high and high school years.

Why "Genesis"?

The word, "genesis," means beginning. It is the first book of the Bible where we see God create us in His image and likeness out of love. We see God's desire for us to enter into a relationship of love with Him. This retreat helps us refocus on renewing our relationship with the Lord. Genesis is a way to return to the beginning of our faith life and focus on how the Lord is working in our lives. Throughout the weekend, youth will have an experience of this loving relationship with God.



The winter Cursillo weekends are fast approaching. Consider setting time aside to



The Basics

What happens when you sign up for HNOJ's The Basics, a four-week course on the basics of our Catholic faith? Here are the kinds of comments we hear from past participants in The Basics:


If you are between jobs or looking to develop your career, then the Career Transition Group meeting is the place to be. Career Transition Group provides tools and resources to help people reach their career goals.

Set Up and Manage Your Electronic/ Automatic Contributions through WeShare Online Giving
