

Scripture of the Week



"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." (Ps 95:8)

The Israelites asked Moses to be their mediator with God. We are told that they feared they would die if they heard the voice of the Lord. (See Ex 20:18-19). Moses obliges, but foretells that there will be one of their kin who will speak to the people on behalf of God - a prophet.

Jesus is that Prophet. He is the Mediator who speaks exactly what God wants the people - wants *us* to hear. The psalmist tells us to listen to the voice of the Lord and not harden our hearts to what He wants to tell us.

Could it be that the hearts of the Israelites had hardened and that is why they no longer wished to hear God's voice? Could it be that our hearts are sometimes hardened and we fail to hear the voice of the Lord?
