





Looking Forward to Seeing You this Lenten Season

The events leading up to the Super Bowl, and the excitement surrounding the game were fun. I enjoyed watching the game with



friends and all that I had hoped for was realized. I wasn't cheering for any particular team to win. Rather, that the score of the game would be close and the commercials entertaining. On Monday, as reports of our visitors returning home filled the airwaves, along with words of thanks to everyone who helped make the entire event a huge success, the thought of returning to normal was inviting. However, it soon became apparent that the return to normal would include the season of Lent. It is hard

to believe that Lent begins on Wednesday. Yes, February 14th is not only Valentine's Day, but it is also Ash Wednesday, a day of prayer, fasting, and abstaining from meat.

Since the creation of the world, God enters, really enters, the world to break into our lives for one purpose. It is because of love. The Covenants revealed in Sacred Scripture are the means by which God entered into relationship with His people. Through every encounter God enters into a relationship of love. This is His sole purpose, to allow us to enjoy in the eternal communion of love.

Sin is a movement away from that love. The separation from the Lord, others, and even oneself is painful and regretful. However, Lent calls us to return wholeheartedly to the God of mercy. The path of return includes prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is the kind of prayer that directs our attention to the Lord who sent His Son to teach, heal, forgive and lead us back to the Father. Prayer can help expose areas of sin and self-deception while at the same time, opening us to the consolation that only the Lord gives. This path will lead Jesus and us to the cross. The good news is that the cross shows us that death leads to life. The fasting that we all do carries within it the possibility of uniting ourselves with the poor, vulnerable and hungry. It also heightens the awareness of our own hunger for the Lord. Giving alms allows us to express our love of the Lord through tangible expressions of charity and concern for our neighbor.

Lent is such an awesome season of grace. This week's bulletin, along with the web site, contains many of the Lenten opportunities taking place here at Holy Name of Jesus. I look forward to seeing you on Ash Wednesday and throughout the Lenten season.

Abstinence and Fasting During Lent

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



What is Virtus and why do we need to attend?

Adult volunteers in this Archdiocese who have ongoing contact with youth or vulnerable adults are required to attend a "VIRTUS: *Protecting God's Children for Adults*" session. Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles and anyone interested in the protection of children and youth are invited to attend. The VIRTUS session consists of a presentation of printed materials, videos and group discussion. Among other things, VIRTUS attendees will learn to recognize the signs and symptoms that indicate a child or vulnerable adult is being abused or exploited in some way, environmental factors to be aware of in the physical space of the parish or school, how abusers operate and what we can do to help educate children and vulnerable adults about how to respond to inappropriate behavior. A typical session is 2 ½ hours.

Scripture of the Week



"Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him and said to him, 'I do will it. Be made clean.'"

(Mk 1:41)

In the time of Moses, if someone was a leper, they were an outcast - required to live outside the community. They lived in a state of division from the rest of the people. This was still true in the time of Jesus, but when Jesus came His desire was to unite people not divide them. Just as He cured the leper and brought him back into the community, He wants to cure us. We may not have leprosy, but the spiritual illness of sin separates us from others just as the physical illness of leprosy did for the Jews.

When we have sinned, all we have to do is approach Jesus with a sincere heart, rending our hearts rather than our garments. He wants to heal all our infirmities - especially the spiritual ones.

Go to Jesus in conversation. Go to Jesus in prayer. Go to Jesus in the Sacrament of Confession. He is waiting to stretch out His hand and make us well.
