

Do You Know Someone Sick or Homebound?

The same Lord Jesus who went about healing the sick and infirm in Galilee is at work today in His Church, meeting the sick, consoling and strengthening them by forgiving their sins and offering them His healing touch. This happens primarily through the Sacraments of the Church, through Eucharist, Reconciliation and Anointing, wherein Christ's presence and power are effectively communicated through sacred signs instituted by the Lord. The Letter of St. James (5:14-16) describes one such sacrament when he writes:

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

Thus, one of the most important ways in which the Church ministers to the needs of the sick and dying is through these sacraments, and the priests of Holy Name of Jesus are eager to serve the sick and the dying in this unique capacity.

The ministry to the sick is not limited to the sacraments, however. Holy Name is also blessed with a host of lay volunteers, who are eager to visit the sick and the homebound in order to offer them comfort, prayer, companionship and a listening ear. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are also able to bring our Eucharistic Lord to those who are unable to be present for Holy Mass,

so that those suffering from pain and loneliness can know their closeness to their Suffering Lord. In these and other important ways, the faithful of our parish continue the work of Christ.

In the past it was easier to accomplish this important work, as hospitals and care facilities would ordinarily notify local parishes if one of their members was admitted to their care. However, with recent privacy restrictions, these lines of communication have been cut off. Fortunately, most hospitals have a priest assigned to care for Catholic patients. At the same time, we rely more than ever on the charity of friends and family to let us know when one of their loved ones is in need. If you know someone who sick, homebound or approaching the end of life, please let us know by contacting our office or Fr. Evans so that we can do our best to serve those in need.

Special mention should also be made of emergency situations, when due to extreme illness or imminent danger of death, there is a more urgent need for priestly care. There are special gifts that only a priest can give in such hours and the priests of Holy Name of Jesus make it a top priority to attend to those in crisis situation. So please do not hesitate to notify us. Our emergency line for after-hours calls is 763-233-0259.

Presentation of the holy oils, community foot washing and the lighting of our watchfire are highlights of this Eucharistic celebration.

What happens at a watchfire? Starting with the lighting of the fire at the end of the Holy Thursday liturgy and ending with the Easter Vigil, a watchfire is tended by volunteer groups who pray, sing, watch and wait together. Sign-up sheets with two-hour intervals will be in the Good Samaritan Center.

Funeral Ministers Needed

"Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted." (Matthew 5:4)

Holy Name of Jesus celebrates an average of 35-40 funerals annually. If you have experienced the death of a loved one you understand how important the prayers, care and support of your faith community are. Holy Name of Jesus has a dedicated group of parishioners that make themselves available to serve families in their time of grief. We are currently in need of volunteers to serve as Acolytes and Sacristans.

Sacristans prepare items used during the funeral Mass including hosts, wine, communion vessels, linens, etc. This preparation takes place about thirty minutes before the start of the liturgy. Sacristans also serve as Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion when needed. After Mass, the Sacristan puts away the items used in their proper storage place.

Acolytes aid the Presider during various parts of the liturgy. Duties include carrying the Processional Cross in at the beginning and end of the Mass, assisting the Presider with the Presentation of Gifts, lighting charcoal and placing incense in the thurible for incensing, and serving as Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion when needed.

All of those involved in the funeral ministry participate as needed. It is an on-call ministry that usually takes place in mid-morning. Training is provided. Easter Sunday Singers Needed



Holy Name of Jesus is pleased to welcome Fr. Dale Korogi from Ascension School and Parish in North Minneapolis at all of the Masses the weekend of March 17 and 18 as we highlight the relationship between Holy Name of Jesus and Ascension.

Ascension has been a long time mission partner of HNOJ and their ministry makes an immediate, daily impact on the underserved population in North Minneapolis.

Fr. Dale along with students and staff from Ascension School will be at Holy Name of Jesus to talk about the impact that our support and long standing relationship has made and the great work happening over at Ascension.

The true success in Ascension School is that they are pulling children forward from extraordinarily challenging situations and giving them a future full of hope. At Ascension, 100% of their scholars get their high-school diplomas as compared to Minneapolis Public Schools graduation rate of 50%.

Who they serve:

- 96% are students of color (Latino, African Immigrant, African American, Hmong)
- 24% are English Language Learners
- 77% are eligible for free or reduced lunch
- 67% are non-Catholic

Ascension Church and School continue to have a huge impact on Minneapolis' North Side with steady and growing support from the community. Ascension Catholic School enrollment continues to grow each year. The school turns no child away because of a family's inability to pay full tuition. With a goal to put each student on a path to college, Ascension instills in its students that the expectation of each student is to graduate from high school and go onto college.

Ascension School welcomes and depends on volunteers from the community. With more than 300 eager learners in kindergarten through eighth grade and a rigorous curriculum, volunteers play an important role in supporting our students. HNOJ is proud of our partnership with Ascension and excited about the future opportunities for this relationship. HNOJ and Ascension have formed a small committee to discuss and dream about our relationship going forward.
