



Pastoral Care: Ministry of the Sick

Holy Name is blessed with a host of lay volunteers, who are eager to visit the sick and the homebound in order to offer them comfort, prayer, companionship and a listening ear. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are also able to bring our Eucharistic Lord to those who are unable to be present for Holy Mass, so that those suffering from pain and loneliness can know their closeness to their Suffering Lord. In these and other important ways, the faithful of our parish continue the work of Christ.



In the past it was easier to accomplish this important work, as hospitals and care facilities would ordinarily notify local parishes if one of their members was admitted to their care. However, with recent privacy restrictions, these lines of communication have been cut off. Fortunately, most hospitals have a priest assigned to care for catholic patients. At the same time, we rely more than ever on the charity of friends and family to let us know when one of their loved ones is in need. If you know someone who sick, homebound or approaching the end of life, please let us know by contacting our office or Fr. Evans so that we can do our best to serve those in need.

Special mention should also be made of emergency situations, when due to extreme illness or imminent danger of death, there is a more urgent need for priestly care. There are special gifts that only a priest can give in such hours, and the priests of Holy Name make it a top priority to attend to those in crisis situation. So please do not hesitate to notify us. Our emergency line for *after-hours* calls is 763-233-0259.
