

Jesus in the Breadline

*Excerpt reprinted from May 2013 Newsletter,

Sharing and Caring Hands is a ministry where Holy Name of Jesus parishioners have been the hands of Christ for over 32 years, seeing Christ's face in those in need.

"For I was hungry and you gave me food..." - Matthew 25:35

I once heard a Jesuit priest refer to Matthew 25 (The Last Judgment), from which this passage is taken, as "The Final Exam." It shows how important it is for us personally and as a Christian people to help and feed "the least of my brethren."

Thus, we are called to "feed the poor"—not just on Thanksgiving or Christmas, but continually. That has been the call of the Holy Name of Jesus ministry at Mary Jo Copeland's Sharing and Caring Hands.

Now for over 32 years, since Mary Jo Copeland opened the downtown doors of Sharing and Caring Hands to the poor, parishioners and families of HNOJ have been serving meals to all in need—totaling close to 100,000 meals served since its inception.

Every third Sunday, groups of parishioners gather at Sharing and Caring Hands, located down the street from Target Field, to prepare and serve a hot lunch to about 200 of the hungry and poor. They are all very appreciative—and they tell us they really, really like the chili dog platter we serve. It is a favorite! Holy Name of Jesus presently has over 70 families who volunteer to serve this lunch.

Who are the "hungry" that we serve? There are many: the homeless, the chronic unemployed, the broken families, the immigrants lost in the city, victims of abuse and children of poverty.

But that's not all. On the back wall of the dining room at Sharing and Caring Hands is a silhouette picture of people huddled together, hunched over and humble, tired and weary, in need of a meal. And in that breadline, one among the many is familiar—in fact, it's a face that has been recognized for 2,000 years.

We like to bring families with their children back to this picture after we serve a meal. We'll point to this central figure and ask the children, "Did you see Him? Did you see Jesus today?"

"Whatever you did for the least of my brethren, you did for me."



A sincere thank you to Wanda and Ed Sweeny for their years of involvement and leadership in the HNOJ Ministry to Sharing and Caring Hands. As they hand off the leadership and coordination to Bob Ziegeweid, Molly and Tom Malik, and Rachel and Jens Holthis (Bob's daughters and son-in-laws), a smooth transition is taking place for our present volunteers.
