One Catechumen's Journey

I was raised Baptist but attended many Christian churches as I grew up. Unfortunately, I had negative experiences. When I met my future wife in college, she was Catholic so I would attend church with her occasionally and that was the Church in which we were married. I also agreed to raise our future children in the Church.

For the next 17 years I resisted becoming Catholic myself. I thought that individual morality and personal belief in God was enough. I blamed organized religion for many negative things. It was my wife who raised our children in the faith bringing them to Mass each week in spite of my negativity. After eighteen years of marriage, in 2016, a seed of faith was planted. We visited Italy and the Vatican. It was then that I decided that coming into the Catholic Church was something that would not only be good for me, but for my marriage and our children.

In the fall of 2017, I acted on that seed and joined RCIA. Initially I felt awkward. As the months passed, I began to understand the meaning of the weekly Gospel readings and came to know that it is not enough to simply profess belief, I had to live it. I came to see that the Catholic or universal Church and all she taught was rooted in love - the love of Jesus for us. I found myself praying the Rosary (a gift from my sponsor), with growing frequency until, by Lent, it was a daily prayer. I started spending time in Adoration in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel and continue to do so.

I began to examine my life and choices I had made in the past. I came to appreciate the beauty and truth behind the Beatitudes and Commandments. I came to know them not as tests of my faith, but gifts of love. Through them, as well as

prayer and Scripture, I could become a better person, spouse, parent and friend. I also began to notice the trials and needs of those around me. As my faith grew, so did my peace.

As Easter drew near, I found increasing harmony in life and with my choices. I looked forward to Holy Week and living my faith - becoming more involved with the parish community. I wanted to give to the Church as I am able and share my gifts with others.

As Holy Week came, I wasn't sure what to expect. Spending time reflecting on the passion and death of Jesus caused me to become emotional. The haunting words "Stay with me, remain here with me, watch and pray..." affected me deeply. I felt the ultimate sacrifice Jesus made for me as I stayed at the Watchfire until 1a.m. on Holy Thursday night.

I entered deeply into Good Friday taking it all in - the music (I played my harp), the Rosary, Stations of the Cross and the Celebration of the Passion that night. Veneration of the Cross moved me deeply and again that same haunting melody: "Stay with me, remain here with me.... Once again, I sat at the Watchfire for hours in the falling snow contemplating the significance of the snowfall as a metaphor for the gift of Baptism the following evening.

Saturday evening, I, along with the others, watched as the Easter candle was lit from the watchfire - the beginning of our new lives. The whole Vigil Mass with all the beauty of the Scripture, the homily and the music was a humbling experience as I realized that this was for each of us.

Almost before I thought it possible, I was in front of the congregation stating my intention to be Baptized along with my fellow Catechumens. Shortly thereafter, we joined those who were Candidates for Confirmation and were sealed with the Oil of Chrism. (The smell of the oil is something I will never forget.) Finally, we joined the community in the Eucharist.

I think I speak for all of us when I say I feel blessed to be a part of this community. The journey with all those who accompanied us - the whole community - was amazing. Now the "real work" begins - to share the light of Christ that we have received, no matter what life throws our way. God Bless!

VIRTUS® Session at HNOJ

Saturday, May 19, 2018
8 a.m. in Emmaus ABCD

What is VIRTUS and why do we need to attend?

Adult volunteers in this Archdiocese who have ongoing contact with minors or vulnerable adults are required to attend a "VIRTUS: Protecting God's Children for Adults" session. This session is free and open to parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles and anyone interested in the protection of children and youth and vulnerable adults.

The VIRTUS session consists of a presentation of printed materials, videos and group discussion. Among other things, VIRTUS attendees will learn to recognize the signs and symptoms that indicate a child is being abused or exploited in some way, environmental factors to be aware of in the physical space of the parish or school, how abusers operate and things parents can do to help educate their children about how to respond to inappropriate behavior. The video also includes information on abuse of vulnerable adults. A typical session is 2 ½ hours.

To pre-register for this session, please visit www.virtus.org. It is very important that you pre-register to make sure your attendance is counted. It also lets the Archdiocese contact you if your session is canceled.





Stewardship
