#### Dont Miss the Rummage Sale!

Our annual parish rummage sale will be June 21-23. This sale is a huge cooperative event that raises funds for many local organizations and provides a place for the needy to purchase great goods inexpensively. And you get to clean out your closets! There are many ways that you can help (and have fun doing it):

- First collect and save useable items that your family no longer needs: clothing and shoes in good condition, furniture (except large upholstered pieces like sofas and easy chairs-take those to Bridging), books, sporting goods and outdoor equipment, baby equipment, luggage, household goods, jewelry, collectibles and decorations are all saleable. We CANNOT accept large appliances, TVs, computers, printers and monitors, VHS players, CD or record players, stereos and speakers, large office furniture, yard and garden chemicals, paint or construction leftovers, Christmas trees and garland, large exercise equipment, lighting fixtures, drapery rods, drop-side cribs, mattresses or headboards, car seats older than five years. Deliver your donations to the school entrance Sunday, June 17, 1-4 p.m.; 9 a.m.-7 p.m. Monday and Tuesday, June 18-19; 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Wednesday, June 20.
- We will need lots of help setting up for the sale June 17-20. We'll be setting up the displays and shelving starting at 12 p.m. on Sunday. On Monday and Tuesday, we will work 9 a.m.-7 p.m. and Wednesday from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Sorting, organizing and pricing this sale is a big effort and also lots of fun. Lunches provided! All volunteers who give eight hours of their time to set-up are eligible to attend a private presale Wednesday evening. NEW THIS YEAR: If you sign a pledge to work eight hours during the sale OR four hours during the Saturday clean up, you may also shop at the Wednesday pre-sale.
- During the sale we need cashiers, carrying help and folks to keep reorganizing the merchandise. We always need large shopping bags, so you can donate those, too.
- Lunches and snacks for volunteers are provided. We appreciate folks who bring food for the helpers (sandwich fixings, snacks, pop, salads and desserts are all good). Food donations can be dropped off in the kitchen any time all week.
- Clean-up on Saturday afternoon is also a big effort; we will need lots of folks who can help out, beginning at noon and ending around 3 p.m. Also, if you are willing to load up your pickup, car or SUV with a few bags of rummage remains to take to Goodwill or ARC, we would love to hear from you.

#### **Cemetery Decorations**

Our Holy Name of Jesus cemetery is a place that helps to sanctify the memories of those buried within the cemetery and creates an environment which awakens faith and brings consolation. Policies for management of the cemetery grounds assist in protecting the HNOJ Cemetery, creating and preserving its beauty and ensuring that the interests of all concerned are addressed. It is important to note that all the cemetery land is owned by the church and that the graves themselves are not real property but represent a right to burial in a specific space. Memorial stones are the property of the owner or family.

We know that decorating graves is a very personal and important part of grieving and remembrance, so we respect and support families in doing so. To manage the cemetery and graves with proper care, however, we ask that you honor the following policies:

- It is not permissible to plant anything in the cemetery grounds.
- Decorations permitted include: You may place two of the following on a grave: plant stand (for a potted plant) OR solar light OR a small statue or memento, which must be placed on the grave stone. Small veterans' markers or flags are also permitted. Please note that there is a water spigot on the west side of the garage so that you may water potted plants.
- The list of prohibited decorations includes rocks, vigil lights, pictures, boxes, shells, toys, glassware, sprinkling cans, bird houses, receptacles, or similar articles. These are not permitted on any grave, lot or trees. These items make upkeep of the graves difficult and pose potential danger or damage when we are weed whipping around graves.
- The Cemetery is not responsible for the loss, theft or damage to any personal items on the grave site.
- Visitors may not throw or scatter materials on the cemetery grounds. Dumping of potted plants and dirt on cemetery grounds is not permitted.

Donations to help maintain the cemetery grounds are always welcome!
