If anyone would like to help out from time to time we are always looking for people willing to sign-up to make salads for funeral lunches on a more regular basis. In a typical month it is likely you would be asked just once to make/bring a salad for a funeral. You say yes when you can, and no when you're unable to for any reason. You can request to be contacted by phone, email or text. The guidelines are simple:

- Make or purchase a salad that will serve at least ten. The salad can be any type but it is not necessary to add meat as there will always be ham served at the funerals.
- Deliver the salad to the kitchen on the day of the funeral, usually around 10 a.m.
- If delivery needs to be made the night before, or very early on the day of the funeral, please mark the salad "funeral" and place it in the refrigerator just inside the kitchen door off the Good Samaritan Center.

Small Group Ministries: An Avenue for Building our CommUNITY

As Catholics, we believe that God created us in His likeness and image. In our spiritual journey, we are called to a deeper and deeper conversion to grow in holiness and become more God-like. God has revealed that He is One but is not alone. The essence of God is a triUNITY, a commUNITY of Love expressed in the Blessed Trinity, a pivotal mystery of our faith. As believers, we are invited to imitate the loving intimacy of this community. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "Unity is the essence of the Church." (CCC 797).

Jesus came to tell us and to show us how to be holy. He said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these." (Mark 12: 30-31)

This is a timely and relevant message for our frantic lives! Through the advancement of technology, we are more connected than ever to our neighbors---at least digitally. Yet, paradoxically, we feel more isolated, hungry for authentic relationships and, and despite numerous virtual



friendships, loneliness has become a public health epidemic. Just as we are intentional about carving out time for our personal prayer, it's good to set time aside for cultivating deep friendships, for building our faith community. This is a tall order---so we lean heavily on the graces of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist to nurture our souls, for the Holy Spirit to provide counsel and consolation and on each other for friendship, support and encouragement.

To help all cultivate a sense of community, we are enhancing our Small Group Ministry at HNOJ. You can see a list of the ongoing groups at www.hnoj.org/smallgroups. Our vision is

to build the Small Group Ministry so that, eventually, there will be a small group option for everyone in our parish family.

Ministry That Keeps on Giving Discipleship Through Service

As Catholics, we value the importance of passing on our faith to the next generation. Although parents are the primary teachers, we as a community are also called to support this important mission. Here at Holy Name of Jesus, working together to bring our community closer to Christ is a constant theme in all that we do. One tangible way to spread the Catholic Faith is through service in the Faith Formation program. There are several ways for you to participate in this ministry: as a small group leader for Senior High or Middle School CREW; as a Catechist (teacher of the faith) for preschoolers or elementary students. Passing on the faith and building relationships while entering more deeply into our faith is what this ministry is all about. Below are a few personal testimonies by Elementary Catechists as well as Middle School and High School CREW Small Group Leaders. They share their experiences not only about their work with the children and teens, but also about how this experience has been reflected in their own lives outside the classroom:

"Their attentive listening, kind words and genuine care for one another, was inspiring. I could not help but smile and thank God for their beautiful example of how to live as Jesus taught us; full of love for one another!"

"Being a small group leader has been an incredible blessing in my life. I have been so inspired by the desire of the teens to know and love Jesus and to follow His plan for their lives" explains Amelia Uppgaard, a High School Small Group Leader. "I have also loved the chance to deepen my own study of the faith, to mentor youth individually and to build friendships with other adult leaders."

"I have had the opportunity to serve as a catechist as all three of my children progressed through the Holy Name of Jesus' Faith Formation program. That means that I have had the pleasure of teaching Sunday School, Elementary, Middle and Senior High Faith Formation, including Confirmation," says Michele Kirchoff. "It is wonderful to see children and youth grow in their faith and be a part of that journey. I am always amazed by the amount of insight and faith the faith formation students have as a result of the programs at HNOJ." We love to watch the kids grow closer to Christ and potentially have a small part in that journey. It is amazing to see the change and growth and to have them want more too!"

What does being a Catechist look like?

The primary purpose of a catechist is to assist and encourage children in their Faith Formation in a safe and nurturing environment. Catechists teach ages ranging from preschool to fifth grade. Preschoolers and kindergartners participate in Sunday School classes during the Sunday Liturgies and 1st through 5th graders participate in Faith Formation Classes on Wednesday evenings or Sunday mornings. Catechists prepare and teach these classes using provided curriculum, lessons and materials. Teaching materials are handed out at the Catechist Training Session in mid-September and classroom materials are provided weekly. Catechists encourage our children in their formation

What does being a Middle School CREW Small Group Leader look like?

Middle School CREW Small Group leaders journey with 8-12 middle schoolers as they encounter Jesus Christ. This is achieved primarily through leading teens each week in intentional discussion, as well as accompanying them to the talk and activity portion of the evening. Ultimately, these small group leaders serve as role models of authentic discipleship and provide a place of belonging for middle schoolers. The HNOJ Adult Core Team is a community of adults who commit each year to serve as youth ministry leaders here at Holy Name of Jesus. Together they: call and invite young people to the love of Christ with the Catholic Church; welcome, mentor and inspire the teens of this community; grow in knowledge and love of the Catholic Church; serve in HNOJ CREW Small Group Ministry (either monthly or weekly); assist in the planning and leading of retreats; as well as discern and implement the vision of Youth Ministry here at Holy Name of Jesus. New Life - It's For Everyone

New life! There is nothing like it to make our spirits soar-whether it is a new baby born into the family or the first signs of spring after a long winter. New life brings with it hope and we all need hope in our lives. Besides hope, we all have a deep desire for truth and beauty and goodness. These are the hallmarks of the Catholic faith which is the greatest hope as well as the fullest sense of truth, beauty and goodness that we can share with someone.

If you don't believe this, just ask a person who has shared in the experience by coming into the Church through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). They will tell you what it means to be given hope and the fullness of truth, beauty and goodness. Everyone knows someone who came into the Catholic Church through RCIA, right?

RCIA has been around since the early days of the Church. The first followers of Christ were serious in sharing with others the Good News of Jesus Christ and the hope and love He brought to us. Jesus IS the embodiment of truth, beauty and goodness. It was natural for them to want to share this with others. In those days, the initiation process was longer (often one to three years) and included sharing in a communal life.

Today, the formal process is about eight to ten months long, but still requires a communal life. Those who are seeking to join the Church will attend sessions that will

*in*form them, but they still require a community to help *form* them. That is where you, me and all of us in the Holy Name family come in.

We all need to be involved. For some that means just being a friendly face or a willing pray-er, supporting them with prayer. For others it means being a part of the RCIA Team, attending the RCIA sessions and being a presence for them. For all of us it means being alive in our faith and excited to share what it means to us. It is always good to share with others something that we feel is important and exciting. What could be more exciting than making sense of this life and walking toward the eternal life?

Everybody knows someone who came into the Church through RCIA, right? Don't just ask them what it meant to them. Tell them what it meant to you. They have brought new life to us. Thank them for this life and for their witness as they journeyed to full membership in the Church.

Don't know someone who has come into the Church through RCIA? Maybe you should think about sharing with someone the goodness, truth and beauty of the Catholic faith. Your faith and enthusiasm may be just what they need to help them decide to fully immerse themselves in the oneness of the Church intended by Christ. "Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one" (Jn 17:11).
