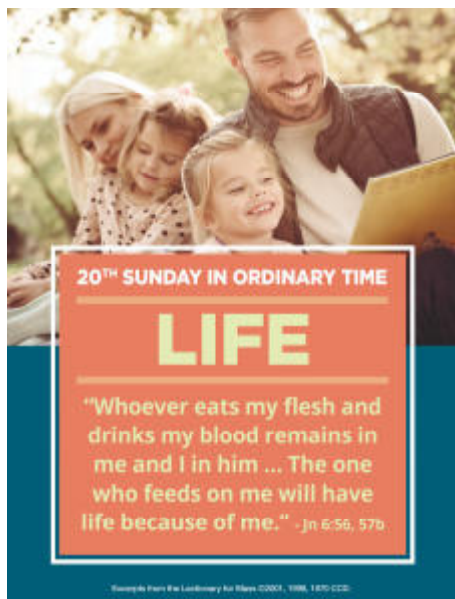

Why We Adore?

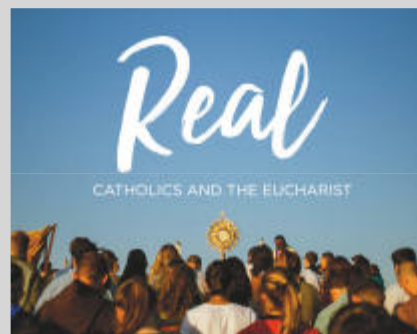

It can happen all too easily in the more regular activities of our lives: repetition leads to routinization, and routines sooner or later become automatic, such that, if we are not careful, we can find ourselves merely going through the motions of life without actually meaning or intending them.

And this can happen not only in mundane activities, but also in the most meaningful ones. It is not particularly troubling to us if things like shopping or mowing the lawn become robotic to us. But when the things that are supposed to be the most precious and meaningful in life begin to become unconscious, then we grow disturbed. Even expressions of love between family members, between husband and wife, can become rote and mechanical at times. When we realize this, it causes sorrow and emptiness in our hearts.

Now, this phenomena is not a reason to dismiss the role of ritual and routine in life. Indeed, the fact that our hearts can so easily grow numb in their activities speaks, more than anything, to our keen need for ritual. It is precisely when our hearts are not feeling what they should that we most need to say "I love you." Indeed, this ritual might be the only thing that can shake our souls out of their sluggishness.

In the end, however, the goal of such rituals is to lead our hearts back toward a fully intentional and



meaningful movement of love. Though for seasons, we often must endure a lag of the heart in our activities, none of us is long satisfied with the mere repetition of empty and external motions.

How sad it is that even Mass can become this way for us as Catholics. What should be the most meaningful, most profound, most ardent activity of our lives—the worship of God—can itself become an experience of merely “going through the motions” in a mechanical or robotic way.

It would be wrong to blame the rituals themselves for this problem: their purpose is to lead us into an activity greater than any we can accomplish on our own. Ultimately, even with the gift of the Holy Spirit, none of us sinners has the internal resources to worship God as He deserves to be worshiped. For that, we need to be led by Jesus, and by His Body, the Church, and this requires a certain amount of external training and discipline.

But the goal of such “training” is to lead us to an intentional and meaningful movement of the heart: what the Second Vatican Council called “conscious and active

Scripture of the Week



"... the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."
(Jn 6:51)

Wisdom provides for us inviting us to eat and drink from her table. Jesus *IS* Wisdom. He is the food and drink that assures us of a life beyond this one that is eternal - the Eucharist.

This knowledge is too wonderful for us to fully comprehend (see Ps 139:6). But we are called to "taste and see" anyway. It is our choice to believe it or not. We can either respond in faith, trusting the words of Jesus, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven.; whoever eats this bread will live forever." Or we can look at the Eucharist as mere bread and wine - as a symbol of the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Help me to "not continue in ignorance, but understand what is the will of the Lord." Help me to accept, acknowledge and appreciate your true presence in the form of the bread and wine.

participation" in the liturgy. As Jesus made clear in His disputations with the Pharisees, mere rote and external repetition is not enough to lead us to the kingdom of heaven.

All of this speaks to the role of Eucharistic Adoration in the

life of a Catholic. For the heart of the liturgy lies in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist: the mystery that, after the consecration, beneath the external appearances of bread and wine, there lies the inward reality of Jesus' Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, present to us in such a way that we can worship Him, receive Him as our food, and so come to know His presence in our hearts. It is when this mystery dawns on us, when we grasp it, or allow ourselves to be grasped by it, that the liturgy comes alive for us: then its patterns and forms begin to make sense to us and we begin to be swept up into its movement of love. In order to receive Jesus in a fruitful and meaningful way in Communion, we must first come to recognize Him in what looks like ordinary bread and wine.

This is no easy matter, of course, any more than it was easy for the Jews to recognize the Son of God in the humanity of Jesus. In the end, such faith is a gift of God that can only come from above. But the practice of Eucharistic Adoration can help us receive and nourish this gift. By regularly coming before Him and treating Him like God, by bending low before Him and offering Him our hearts, and by asking Him to give us eyes that see, He can help us to recognize Him in the Eucharist, and so help us to enter into the Mass in a deeper, more meaningful way. In this way, the practice of Eucharistic Adoration can be a powerful practice in the development of a Christian's spiritual life.

This is only one reason to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, of course. Another, more important one, is love. We go to the One who has loved us with an unspeakable love in order to love Him in return, to thank Him for His gift of Himself, to lay down our lives before Him, and to ask Him to sanctify our ways, so that we can glorify Him forever in heaven. At the end of the day, this is why we adore.

At next weekend's liturgy, we will conclude our homily series on the Real Presence with an invitation to sign up as a regular adorer here at Holy Name of Jesus. While this may be an intimidating step for some, I encourage you to consider incorporating this practice into your spiritual life. If you are faithful to it, you will not be disappointed.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is starting up. We will begin with Inquiry Sessions as follows:

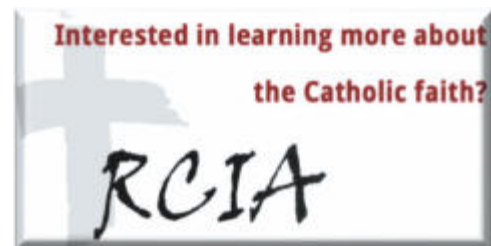
Saturday, Aug. 18, after the 5 p.m. Mass
