Scripture of the Week



"Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice." (Jas 3:16)

Jesus is talking to His disciples about His coming death and resurrection. They are busy arguing over who is the greatest among them. Maybe it is because they do not understand what He is trying to say and/or maybe because they are afraid to ask Him what He is talking about. In any case, they have a wrong focus. They are focused on themselves. They are acting out of pride and selfishness versus humility and love. Saint Paul tells us that conflicts and war arise from our passions like pride.

Jesus redirects the focus of the disciples to a child. Children are dependent and trusting rather than prideful and reliant on self. Even if the disciples do not understand what Jesus is telling them, they need to trust and take to heart what He is attempting to tell them - acting out of love and humility rather than selfishness and pride. We need to do the same. Do we humbly regard others as more important than ourselves? (Phil 2:3).
