



Scripture of the Week



"The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart." (Ps 19:8)

We know that we are not to intentionally harm ourselves or anyone else. Why would Jesus tell us that we should cut off our hand or foot or pluck out our eye if they cause us to sin? Wouldn't that be sinful in itself?

Of course, we are not supposed to intentionally harm anvone - including ourselves. Jesus is making a point through the use of hyperbole or exaggeration. The most important thing is not the life of our physical body, but the life of our soul. The temporary pleasures and treasures of this life rot and corrode. They provide a happiness that is fleeting.

God gives us the gift of the Spirit. This gift is not something we are to guard jealously, but share joyfully. Moses knew that. So did Jesus. It is important that we realize that we have all been gifted in some way and those gifts are to be used to make God known and loved. Used rightly, they bring glory to God in this life and lead to eternal life. What are your gifts? How can you use them to make God known and loved?


