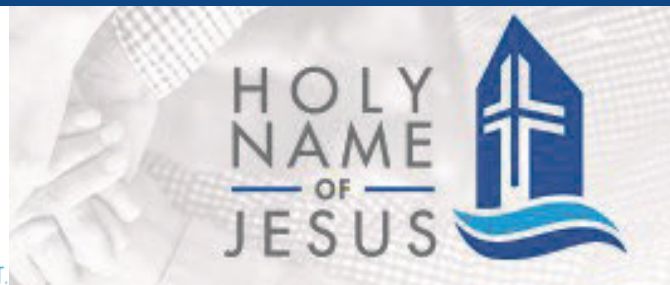

The Epiphany of the Lord

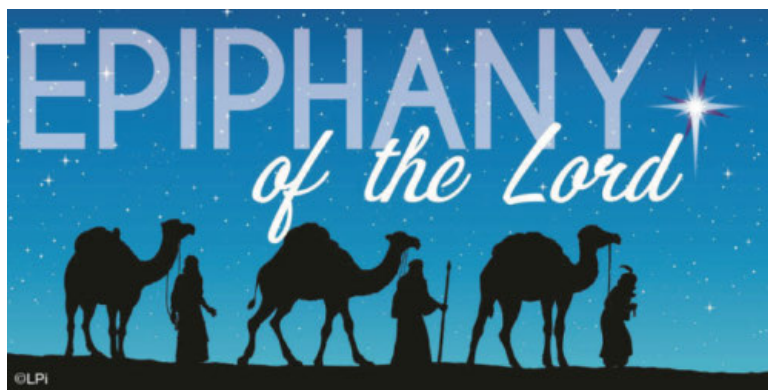
A friend of mine is a young priest who teaches high school physics at a Catholic boys' prep school. Like many today, the boys often think science and religion are enemies. So, he delights in their raised eyebrows when he reminds them his first full-time job as a priest was to be an astrophysicist. He cataloged the size, shape and matter of distant stars. He tells them, "Science gave me more love for God, not less."

The Magi were something like scientist-astronomers. Like today's scientists, they employed disciplined methods of discovering dependable patterns in the world. Their rigorous commitment to the truth led them to the joy of discovering Jesus. Their love for knowledge leads them to worship the Source of all knowledge. Luke says of them, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star."

We may see the universe as cold and empty and feel sad. But why should we do that? The Magi, like my priest-friend, show us there is another way to experience the world. We use our intelligence to discover the beautiful patterns in the world – in mathematics, physics, astronomy, biology, neuroscience and so on – and allow this to lead us to greater love for God. So, my fellow Magi: the world needs us to be overjoyed at finding God in science and, finally and fully, in Jesus.

Scripture of the Week



"We saw His star at its rising and have come to do Him homage"

(Matthew 2:2b)

The word "epiphany" means appearance or manifestation. Today we celebrate the epiphany of Jesus to our world with Matthew's story of the Magi following the star to find "the newborn King of the Jews." We have two versions of what are called the Infancy Narratives in the Bible - today's story from Matthew as well as the familiar story from Luke's Gospel of the shepherds being the first to visit the newborn baby Jesus.

In Luke's story, Jesus is literally a newborn, we hear of His birth and immediately shepherds see and hear angels and go to the stable to see for themselves. The shepherds of Israel in those days were among the lowest "class of citizens". Implicitly, we are being told Jesus came for all the Jews in Luke's story. In Matthew's story, Mary and Joseph are now in a house and Jesus is no longer the baby wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a manger. And it is not shepherds coming to visit, but magi from foreign lands. Matthew is telling us Jesus came for all the world - for all those who take to time to see His light and come and worship Him.

Respect Life Mass and March for Life, Jan. 22

All are welcome to join in praying for the unborn at both the Respect Life Mass and at the March for Life on Sunday, Jan. 22.

The Respect Life Mass will be at noon on Jan. 22, at the Cathedral of St. Paul. This Mass commemorates the millions of lives lost to abortion and the many women and men wounded by abortion's aftermath. It is also an opportunity to recognize those who exemplify pro-life work in our local communities with the Saint John Paul II Champion for Life Award. (This Mass is replacing the Prayer Service for Life.) This event is sponsored by the Archdiocese of St. Paul & Minneapolis Office of Marriage, Family and Life.

The March for Life is organized by Minnesota Concerned Citizens for Life (MCCL) and will take place at the State Capitol in St. Paul at 2 p.m. on Jan. 22.

The bus will pick up attendees in the parking lot of Lunds & Byerlys store in Wayzata at 10:45 a.m. and drop off at the Cathedral. Light in the Darkness, Jan. 13

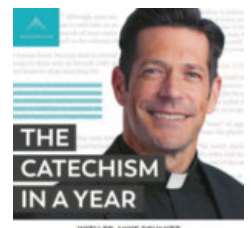
