

### A Little Change to Confession

The U.S. bishops' conference voted in June 2021 to amend the Order of Penance in two ways. Those changes were then approved by the Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments last year, and began on Ash Wednesday, 2023.

1. The translation of the prayer of absolution, said by the priest, has changed slightly to:

"God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and **poured out** the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God **grant** you pardon and peace. And I absolve you from your sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The Vatican also approved an alternative version (there are several already) of the act of contrition for penitents to say while going to confession.

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

2. The bishops also voted to allow priests to use "a selection of stanzas which form a coherent whole" during penance services, instead of using an entire psalm.

This means that more priests may choose to read a selection of scripture both in a communal penance service and in individual confession.



### Scripture of the Week



"But God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ did for us." (Romans 5:8)

Water is the theme for today's First Reading and the Gospel. But water is not the only thing we thirst for. Saint Paul tells us of the love of God which has been poured out into our very hearts. In this act, we are "justified by faith" and given a hope that "does not disappoint". We hear the promise of redemption, a transformation from helplessness because, as Paul concludes, "God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us."

We often have the sense that we must pursue Jesus, we must run after God. And when we think these things, we have it exactly backwards. We are the ones God chases after. As we heard from the Catechism last week, God invites us to be joined to Him. And from Paul today as quoted above. This is the mystery of the water offered to the Samaritan woman in today's Gospel from St. John. That water Jesus promised is the very love of God in the Holy Spirit, poured into us each time we come to the Eucharistic table. God runs after us. We just must stop running away and allow Him to catch us in His loving embrace.
