


Lenten Reflection

"I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem," announces the Lord, "for I have chosen my king from among his sons." Samuel finally goes and anoints the young David as the new king. And his kingdom is glorious; it's the golden age of Israel's earthly history.

How discouraging to see that my own selfish ego is no longer in charge! How long will I grieve that money, power, pleasure and reputation have been rejected as the ruler of my life? He'll slay our goliaths, unite our dispersed energies and build a Temple where God himself will dwell.


Stations of the Cross

Scripture of the Week



"Awake, O sleeper; and rise from the dead, and Christ will give you light." (Ephesians 5:14)

"Live as children of the light" is Saint Paul's command to the Ephesians, but it is a command to us all as well. We are called to leave darkness behind and to allow light to expose everything. This is what happens when we truly repent of our sins and allow God to live in our hearts. This also touches on the miracle of our Gospel reading this week. A physical miracle took place that allowed a man who had been born blind to physically see. The ramifications of this miracle are huge for this man; he had lived his entire life to this point without any awareness of what "sight" was.

Suddenly his entire knowledge of "reality" was blown away. But as great as the miracle was for this man, the miracle extended to those who witnessed the event - if they let it. Did they "see" that Jesus is in the business of driving out darkness being a metaphor for the forgiveness of sin? Are *we* able to "see" this reality? This Lent, can we cast aside our spiritual blindness and accept the miracle of seeing God faceto-face, the miracle of salvation?

You are Invited to the Upper Room (part two)

Last week, we shared about one of our small group ministry options (Quads) and how this model has had an amazing impact on those involved.

Quads are Different

This is not just another small group program or Bible study. The high quality curriculum, developed by Franciscan University in Steubenville, has elements of scripture study with insightful, practical application of faith into realities of life. It is easy to follow and inexpensive.

Witness Statement

A parishioner who had been looking for an opportunity to get connected at HNOJ and joined a Quad with three other women has this to say:

"As a single, working, professional making the time commitment to join a Quad was my first hurdle in participating. My second hurdle was thinking that I wouldn't "fit in" with the other members. I was wrong on both accounts. I made the commitment and found the journey enlightening in so many ways. The quad can be flexible with time, as "life happens",



and I found synergy, alignment and deep connection within my group. I would highly recommend a Quad to anyone wanting to deepen their faith."

Small Groups are one of the highest priorities of the Archbishop's Synod Implementation. In his letter, Archbishop Hebda writes that small groups, "foster the experience in the Upper Room of 'washing of the feet' through personal relationships, building community and supplying formation that will help parishioners grow as missionaries of Christ."
