

He Made His Dwelling Among Us

Each year on March 25, we celebrate the Solemnity of
the Annunciation of the Lord. Here is a beautiful reflection:

The Annunciation celebrates the visit of the angel Gabriel
to the Virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the
mother of Jesus. On this great feast day, we not only
recall Mary's courageous "yes" to God, we also celebrate
the Incarnation of Christ, our Savior. For it was there, in
the womb of a woman, nine months before the
celebration of the manger, that "the Word became flesh
and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14).

The celebration of the Annunciation coincides with the
anniversary of the papal encyclical *Evangelium vitae*
(*The Gospel of Life*). This prophetic document on the
dignity and inviolability of every human life was put forth
by Pope John Paul II on the Solemnity of the
Annunciation in 1995. The intimate connection of these
two events highlights a profound reality about the identity
and value of every human person.

Luke's Gospel tells us that by the power of the Holy Spirit,
Christ would be conceived within the womb of Mary. It
was there, in the womb of the Blessed Mother, that Christ
first took on human flesh and made his dwelling among
us. Like us, the unborn child Jesus grew and developed beneath the shelter of his
mother's loving heart. Through Christ's Incarnation, God chose to share fully and
intimately in our humanity and bridge all distance between God and man, so that
we may dwell together.

The Church teaches us that "by His incarnation the Son of God has united Himself
in some fashion with every man." [1] God desired to dwell among us, as one of us,
in order to bring us salvation. This truth "reveals to humanity not only the
boundless love of God... but also the incomparable value of every human
person." [2]

Each of us is made in the image and likeness of our Creator, to share in the very
life of God himself. This reality "reveals the greatness and the inestimable value of
human life." [3] The human person is "a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of
his presence, a trace of his glory." [4] Created through the love of the Father, each
one of us bears "an indelible imprint of God." [5] By sharing in our humanity, Christ
invites us to share in his divinity, that we might dwell with him for eternity.

Therefore, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel." [6] Through Christ's descent to earth God desires to raise each one of us to the heights of heaven. May we recognize that to proclaim the Gospel of Life is to proclaim Christ, the one who *made his dwelling among us*.

Come and Pray at the Watchfire



Scripture of the Week



"I will put my spirit in you that you may live"
(Ezekiel 37:12a)

Today, our reading from Ezekiel begins with God's promise that He "will open your graves and have you rise from them." Today we also hear St. Paul say, "But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness." And finally, in our Gospel we hear that Jesus has power over death. His dear friend Lazarus has died. While he was still sick, they call for Jesus to come and heal him, but Jesus tarries for two days before finally heading to Bethany. In fact, by the time Jesus arrives, Lazarus has been in the tomb for four days.

Jesus calls for Lazarus's tomb to be opened. Warned that there will be a stench because Lazarus has been there for four days already, Jesus waves off the warning and insists that the grave be opened. He calls for Lazarus to come out of the tomb, and so he does. Each day, the same Jesus invites us to leave our tombs of rotted, stinking sin, of festering apathy and unbelief and come forth. But we often fear to let anyone, even ourselves, let alone Jesus, to wander into this dark and foreboding place. This Lent, can we, like Lazarus, ignore all that and simply answer His call? After all, He offers us the ultimate "spring cleaning"!


