A Holy Week Spotlight - The Altar of Repose Following Mass on Holy Thursday

In the days before the celebration of Easter, the Church gives us powerful liturgies to help us recall and participate in the sacred events of Jesus's life, the events through which God accomplished our salvation. These three liturgies, known as the Sacred Triduum, make present the events of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and most especially, the vigilant waiting of Holy Saturday for the Resurrection. When I first experienced the Triduum liturgies early in high school, it was unlike anything I had experienced before. I loved it. These liturgies have remained, quite simply, my favorite liturgies of the whole year. One flows into the other such that you begin to experience each day more like a faithful disciple who accompanies Jesus from the Last Supper, to calvary and then to the tomb. If you have experienced it before, I encourage you to invite someone to experience it with you, who maybe has not experienced it before.

One part of the Triduum I would like to highlight is the conclusion of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Not only is this liturgy marked by a washing of the feet and special prayers for the celebration of the Eucharist, it also concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament (the Eucharist) to a special altar of repose. In years past, we reposed the Eucharist in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel adjacent the sanctuary. This year, the priest and altar servers will lead us all in procession out of the main church into the Good Samaritan Center, where there will be an altar of repose decorated with linens, flowers and candles surrounding the tabernacle. (Thank you to our environment crew!) As we finish singing, the priest or deacon will leave in silence, and we will be invited to remain in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle for as long as one would like.

Why do we have this as the conclusion? It is because the liturgy is not technically finished. It moves into a period where we watch and pray until the liturgy resumes on Good Friday with the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord

at 3 p.m. It is a time where we accompany Jesus from the Last Supper to the garden of Gethsemane, where He invites His disciples to watch and pray that they will not undergo the test. Not only are we remembering something that took place, but we are also being invited by Jesus to relive it with Him. Jesus invites us to accompany Him in His agony, where we can comfort Him by remaining with Him truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. When you come to Mass on Holy Thursday, make sure you spend at least a few moments with Jesus as He invites you into Gethsemane to watch and pray with

Fasting and Abstinence during Lent

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years until age 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.


12 Ways to Make Holy Week More Meaningful

- 1. **Think prayer!** If you have to work or go to school during Holy Week, think about how you can incorporate prayer breaks into each day.
- 2. **Make an additional sacrifice** by fasting and abstaining from meat on Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday in addition to Good Friday.
- 3. Don't watch television from sundown on Holy Thursday until Easter morning.
- 4. Go to confession.
- 5. Set aside 10 minutes every day to read Passion accounts in the Gospels.
- 6. Make it a point to **forgive** someone on Good Friday.
- 7. Pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary.
- 8. Offer up any pain or difficulties you experience during Holy Week and unite your sufferings with the pain of Christ.
- 9. Pray the Stations of the Cross.
- 10. Attend all of the Triduum liturgies.
- 11. **Invite** family members, friends and neighbors especially people who have strayed from the church to come to church with you.
- 12. Volunteer to help decorate your parish on Holy Saturday for Easter.




A Message from the ACCL


