Divine Mercy Sunday, April 16

"In the evening, when I was in my cell, I saw the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in the gesture of blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From beneath the garment, slightly drawn aside at the breast, there were emancipating two large rays, one red, the other pale. In silence I kept my gaze fixed on the Lord; my soul was struck with awe, but also with great joy. After a while, Jesus said to me, Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world... I desire that there



be a Feast of Mercy. I want this image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter; that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy." (Diary of Saint Faustina, Notebook 1, paragraphs 47 and 49).

This weekend at the conclusion of all our Masses, we will enter into a time of Eucharistic Adoration and pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Those who do not wish to stay for the chaplet are welcome to, after a short time of personal prayer, quietly genuflect and leave during Adoration.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is spoken, and prayed using an ordinary Rosary and begins with one Our Father, Hail Mary and Apostle's Creed.

For each of the five decades, the "Our Father" bead of the rosary, pray: V. Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ,

R. in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

On each of the 10 "Hail Mary" beads, pray:

V. For the sake of his sorrowful Passion,

R. have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Conclusion, repeat three times:

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.



What is VBS? Vacation Bible School is a four-day faithfilled AND fun-filled adventure for participants of ages four through those entering 5th grade in the fall of 2023! Participants who will be four in the fall and are potty trained are eligible to register at the preschool level. During the four days, VBS will investigate specific Bible stories. Each day participants will attend four centers that emphasize the Bible story so they can grow in their understanding as we help bring the Bible story to life in a child-friendly way. Scripture of the Week



"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

(1 Peter 1:3)

Today we hear the familiar tale of "Doubting Thomas" in St. John's Gospel. It is a shame that we tend to remember Thomas first and foremost because of his doubt. In the same reading, just a few lines later he will speak one of the best prayers of all time - "My Lord and my God"! This is such a profound insight and yet we most often recall his doubt.

The other disciples "rejoiced when they saw the Lord" - a noble and worthy response, and they will tell Thomas later in the week that they have "seen the Lord". But Thomas will take it a step further - my Lord **AND my God**. Centuries later Pope St. Gregory will say it like this: "Thomas's doubt healed the wounds of all of our doubts". It was precisely in his response that Thomas removed forever, not just the doubt of Jesus raised from the dead, but of Jesus as true man and True God.

Last century, a Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalska, saw Jesus appear and speak to her. He said of His wounds: "My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. ... From all My wounds, like from streams, mercy flows for souls, but the wound in My Heart is the fountain of unfathomable mercy. From this fountain spring all graces for souls." St. Faustina was canonized on April 30, 2000, the Second Sunday of Easter that year, the Solemnity of Divine Mercy. Jesus, I trust in you.
