
Everyday Stewardship


Book: *The Power and the Glory* by Graham Greene



Scripture of the Week



"I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the father except through me."

(John 14:6)

In today's Second Reading St. Peter, the fisherman - now made a fisher of men, speaks in the words of the common person of the time. He uses the analogy of a tradesman constructing a building and then quotes Scripture, comparing Jesus to a corner stone, which the builder has rejected. In much the same way, the Jewish leaders rejected Jesus and yet He was the true Messiah. He was the one they were waiting for and yet they never recognized Him.

In our Gospel, we have a flashback to the last supper that Jesus shared with His disciples before His passion, death and resurrection. Jesus was telling them that He would leave "to prepare a place" but they did not understand what He was saying. But after the resurrection, all things were made new and new understanding came to His disciples - and to us. Lord, give us the grace to recognize you!


