This summer we are offering a little summer book club with a choice of some amazing Catholic fiction. These titles will be a little more entertaining and a lot less work than what we might read together during the year, but our hope is that they will still have a depth and message that feeds us.

Morning Group

Book: The Power and the Glory by Graham Greene

Timeless and unforgettable, *The Power and the Glory* is a stunning portrait of both physical and spiritual survival by a master dramatist of the human soul. Set in 1930s Mexico, a priest goes on the run from a totalitarian authority and has to face his own demons while seeking salvation. Named one of the one-hundred best novels of the twentieth century by Time magazine, it stands today as Greene's masterpiece.

Scripture of the Week



"Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks for a reason for your hope."

(1 Peter 3:15b)

Today both our First Reading and our Gospel speak of the Holy Spirit. In the First Reading the apostles are praying that the people to whom they preach might receive the Holy Spirit and the apostles then laid hands on them so that they might receive the Holy Spirit - a post Resurrection story from Acts. In our Gospel, we hear Jesus teaching His disciples during the Last Supper - a pre-Resurrection story from St. John's Gospel.

As a church we are still two weeks away from celebrating Pentecost, so we are being prepared for the descent of the Holy Spirit to come. Our Second Reading from St. Peter tells us why and what we celebrate, the "reason for our hope" - accepting Christ sacrificed and then "brought to life in the Spirit". This very Spirit is the other Advocate Jesus promises in the Gospel. Working together, Jesus and the Holy Spirit invite each of us into a new life of unity with the triune God.

Ascension Outreach Weekend, May 20-21

Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Community and Ascension Catholic School have had a sister parish partnership for many years. Ascension, located on the North Side of Minneapolis, serves children from the neighborhoods around the school. A vast majority of the scholars qualify for free or reduced lunch, an indicator of poverty set by the federal government. Children come to Ascension behind academically. With rigorous, databased individualized instruction, scholars grow rapidly. Many make more than one year's growth during a school year. Ascension scholars come to recognize themselves as beloved children of God and learn essential social/emotional skills they will use throughout their lives. They go on to get their high school diplomas and to pursue post-secondary schooling.
