Pentecost - Come, Holy Spirit By Fr. Tim Wratkowski

A week ago, Saturday, the very day that many of our young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis, over fifteen hundred Catholics gathered at Williams Arena to celebrate the conclusion of the Activated Disciples

conclusion of the Activated Disciples Seminar. This seminar involved all those throughout the Archdiocese who



had been asked by their pastor to belong to their parish's Synod Evangelization Team (SET), a group charged by the Archbishop to assist with the implementation of the Synod goals for the next three years. For seven weeks, those belonging to this team learned about discipleship from renowned speaker Jeff Cavins and sought to implement the practices of the disciple more deeply into their lives during a forty-day challenge. The celebration at Williams Arena, which included Mass with Archbishop Hebda and talks by Jeff Cavins and renowned speaker Mary Healy, was a moment of sending forth, much like the Apostles in the upper room who were sent by Jesus after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit.

My main take away from the conclusion of the seminar goes as follows. For many years, we have relied on a Christian culture, which some would call "Christendom", to teach and support the faith. It was a sort of "come and get it" Catholicism. There was not an urgent sense that one needed to "get out there" to make other disciples as our Lord Jesus commanded.

That can no longer be the case because our culture does not teach or promote the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ as revealed in Sacred Scripture and taught by the Church, the teaching authority through which Jesus promised He would guide us to the truth. Thus, the culture that faces us is not altogether much different from the pagan culture encountered by the Apostles. To bring this up is not to condemn the culture but to examine our mode of living the missionary mandate of Jesus. We can no longer expect the culture to bring people to the Church. We must go out to them.

How we do this should be modelled after the example of the Apostles, who were sent out, as Scripture says, with power "from on high." The Apostles were sent out by Jesus with the power of the Holy Spirit. The mission of the Holy Spirit, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, is the mission of Jesus. Jesus continues His mission through the Holy Spirit in each one of us, whom He gave to us at Baptism and who strengthened that gift at our Confirmation, our own participation in the first "Pentecost" event with the Apostles.

Jesus says otherwise. He expects from each of us to foster this gift of the Holy Spirit. A better and holier response would be to pray about it and explore it.

One opportunity can be to participate in a "Life in the Spirit Seminar" at a Catholic Church or in the same seminar when it is hosted by the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis later this year (information to come in the fall). Regardless, it does not take much to invite the Holy Spirit into each day to guide your thoughts, actions and encounters. The Holy Spirit will empower those who implore him, even through a prayer as simple as *Come, Holy Spirit*.

Scripture of the Week



"Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them."

(Acts 2:3)

In our Gospel today we hear St. John recount the first Easter appearance of the risen Jesus to the Apostles, hidden away behind locked doors "for fear of the Jews". He tells them He will be leaving them again, but this time, He will send the Holy Spirit to dwell within them.

Our First Reading from Acts of the Apostles is 50 days later. Jesus does not leave them abandoned - the Holy Spirit arrives in a powerful way. In the following verses of chapter two of Acts, Peter preaches to the very Jews he and the others feared just 50 days before. Acts recounts the conversion of 3,000 people from that preaching alone. Jesus does not leave us abandoned, either. The Holy Spirit is still ready to dwell in the hearts of those who invite Him in. Today is a good day to make that invitation.




A Good Summer Read - Catholic Fiction Book Groups


