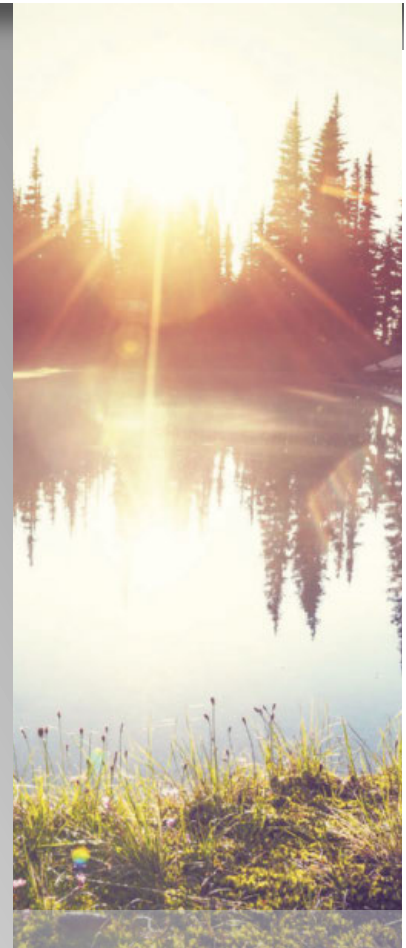

Morning Group

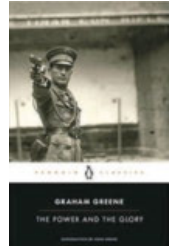
Book: *The Power and the Glory* by Graham Greene

Timeless and unforgettable, *The Power and the Glory* is a stunning portrait of both physical and spiritual survival by a master dramatist of the human soul. Set in 1930s Mexico, a priest goes on the run from a totalitarian authority and has to face his own demons while seeking salvation. Named one of the one-hundred best novels of the twentieth century by *Time* magazine, it stands today as Greene's masterpiece.

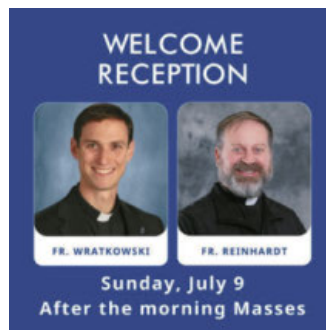
You can sign up for a Holy Hour each week or just come and pray when we have Adoration in the Chapel.

Good Samaritan Fund Gifts

“Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me.” Mt 25:34-37

In keeping with this command to assist those in need, Holy Name of Jesus has been known for its generosity. Those of you who have been around HNOJ for many years will remember the Arnie’s Door Fund, named for Father Arnold, who frequently provided a hand-out or emergency housing to anyone who showed up at his door in distress. Arnie’s Door became the Good Samaritan Fund in 2007 with the addition of monies raised during the New Generation of Ministry Campaign, and is administered through the Catholic Community Foundation. The GSF is now able to provide between \$40-60,000 each year (5% of fund amount) to share with our brothers and sisters with pressing needs.

Some of the money given each year is designated for the aid of parishioners and others in the community who come to us with pleas for assistance. The remainder is available to organizations that have an active connection to HNOJ, especially when parishioners are volunteers there, and make a request for some financial assistance with a service project or providing the needs of the less fortunate. A committee of parishioners meets to consider the requests and mete out the monies, carefully and prayerfully assessing groups who request financial support from the fund for their relationship to HNOJ parishioners and their missions’ closeness to our own. Once the recommendations have been approved by the oversight council, HNOJ is able to present gifts to local groups that serve the needy in our community all because of your generous donations to the Good Samaritan Fund.

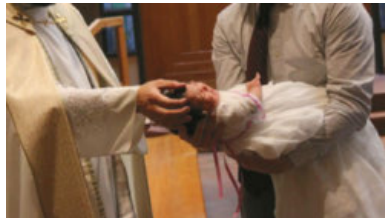
