

The Body and Blood of Christ

This Sunday we celebrate the "Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ," (or Corpus Christi, to be more succinct!)

The Eucharist, like all the Sacraments of the Church, is our participation in the Paschal Mystery of Christ. In the Eucharistic praver, the events of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection are re-presented sacramentally, meaning that through the lens of faith, those grace-filled events become present to us and the fruits of Christ's sacrifice are applied to us in the concrete situations of our lives. In His infinite wisdom, Christ instituted the Eucharist using the form of a meal to help signify the nourishment and strength that we receive from this Sacrament, but of course, this is no ordinary bread and wine. As Christ tells us at every Mass through the voice of the priest, "This IS My Body, this IS the chalice of My Blood." That is why we must treat the Eucharist with the utmost respect and reverence.

Why does Christ choose to give Himself to us this way? As the saying goes, "You are what you eat!" While we don't become Jesus, we do become more Christ-like when we faithfully and reverently receive the Eucharist. Apart from receiving Jesus in the Eucharist, we can also approach the Eucharist in times of prayer outside of Mass, and it has been so edifying for me to see many of you generously devoting time to Our Lord in the Adoration Chapel. This week, let us all pray for a renewed awareness that we become bearers of Christ into the world when we faithfully receive Him in the Eucharist!

Scripture of the Week



"He therefore let you be afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a food unknown to you and your ancestors, so you might know that it is not by bread alone* that people live, but by all that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord." (Deuteronomy 8:3)

Our First Reading this week has Moses reminding the Israelites of how God fed them during their long Exodus from Egypt with manna "a food unknown to you and your fathers." In our Second Reading, St. Paul tells us that the cup and the bread is a participation in the very Blood and Body of Christ. Our Gospel includes the story of Jesus proclaiming the gift He will leave behind in the Eucharist. Some of the Jews hearing this began to quarrel asking how He could possibly give them His flesh as food.

In reply we do not see a "doubling down" by Jesus on the importance and reality of the Eucharist, but a fourfold repetition of the basic doctrine of the Eucharist as True Body and True Blood of Jesus Himself. Within a few more verses beyond the text of today's Gospel we will hear that "many of His followers left Him that day" because of this teaching. A recent study of US Catholics found that only 1/3 of us believe that the Eucharist truly is Jesus - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. It seems many of His followers are still leaving Him.
