The Sacred Heart of Jesus

June is a month full of many celebrations. School is finally out for the summer, and our graduates are celebrating their accomplishments with their families and friends. I hope that all of you may find some time in the coming weeks to spend time with your families and perhaps get outside to enjoy the beautiful Minnesota weather. However, in the Church's life, at least for the past several hundred years, June has been a month dedicated not to human accomplishments or human pride, but the immense and unfathomable Divine love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus comes in part from the mystical visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690). The Lord came to her and showed her His most Sacred Heart, saying "My Divine Heart is so inflamed with love for men, and for you in particular that, being unable any longer to contain within Itself the flames of Its burning Charity, It must spread

them abroad by your means, and manifest Itself to mankind in order to enrich them with the precious graces of sanctification and salvation necessary to withdraw them from the abyss of perdition." That is some pretty intense love! So great is Christ's love for us, that His Heart simply cannot contain it.

Our world is full of hatred and violence, and perhaps these even invade our lives from time to time. Let us take the model of Christ's love "to heart" this week. His Heart burns not with the fire of violence, but with the fire of self-gift. His Heart bears the wounds of His Passion not to rebuke us, but to show us what He was willing to suffer for us. His Heart bears the Cross not to flaunt the weight of our sins, but to show us the greatness of His triumph over sin.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

Scripture of the Week



"You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation." (Exodus 19:6a)

The seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter are over for this Liturgical Year and so we enter Ordinary Time. To our modern ears we hear "ordinary" as being something mundane and usual, for that is how the English word "ordinary" is defined and used. But the "ordinary" in Ordinary Time comes from the Latin word ordinarius which means "order" or "to order" - specifically in the context of Ordinary Time it is best translated as ordinal - as in ordinal numbers: first, second, third and so on.

There is nothing "ordinary" about God nor the graces He offers. Our First Reading from Exodus has Him telling us that if we listen to Him and keep His covenant that we will be His special possession. St. Paul in today's reading from Romans says, "But God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us." The Gospel from Matthew tells of Jesus giving authority to His disciples over unclean spirits and to cure every disease and illness. As His disciples, He offers us the same gifts. This is the very extraordinary God we serve. Pray we do not receive such gifts as "ordinary".

A Prayer to St. Joseph, Defender of Life




Is God Calling You to Be an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion?
