Mission Appeal for the Diocese of Ootacamund (India)

This weekend, Aug. 12-13, we will have a
mission appeal for the Diocese of
Ootacamund, India.

The diocese of Ootacamund was
established in 1955 in the mountainous area
of Tamil Nadu State in India by Pope Pius
XII. It has a Catholic population of c.98,000
which would be 5% of the total population of
that area. About 150 priests and 415
religious nuns serve in about 70 parishes
and 22 high schools in this diocese. About
two-thirds of the faithful of the diocese are
illiterate and mostly daily-wage laborers and
farmers earning about \$4 a day with which
the families cannot afford to send their
children to school.

Apart from people with different cultures, the diocese is endowed with
different aboriginal tribes both in Nilgiris and Erode districts. These tribal
people do not have opportunities for education. More than 38% of the
population are illiterate. As there are no proper roads to the hilly tribal
villages, we have established boarding schools in the small towns where the
tribal children could have education.

By God's grace, we have been blessed with a great number of vocations for
priests and nuns. However, with our meager resources we find it difficult to
support our seminarians to prepare for their priesthood. Due to lack of funds,
we were forced to limit our candidates to our seminary.

The funds raised from this appeal will specifically be spent for the room and
board and educational expenses of these poor children and for the education
of the seminarians of our diocese. You can make checks out to

Scripture of the Week



"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matthew 14:31b)

Last week we had powerful reminders of God's providential abundance of gifts and love. Today we are reminded of two essentials that open our hearts and minds to His gifts. In our First Reading we hear the story of Elijah waiting to hear what the Lord has to say to him; winds, crushing rocks, an earthquake and roaring fire all come and the Lord does not speak. Finally a "tiny whispering sound" follows the fire and the Lord comes to speak to Elijah.

In our Gospel, Jesus sends the disciples ahead while He goes to pray by Himself for a time. The disciples are caught in a storm and are tossed about on the waves when they see Jesus walking on the surface of the water towards them. Fearing a ghost, they recognize Jesus's voice but Peter hedges the bet and asks Jesus to command him to come. Jesus does and Peter begins to walk on the water but then becomes frightened and begins to sink. Jesus catches his hand and Peter is saved. In all of this, two words tell us how to achieve the hope of last week's readings - listen and believe.

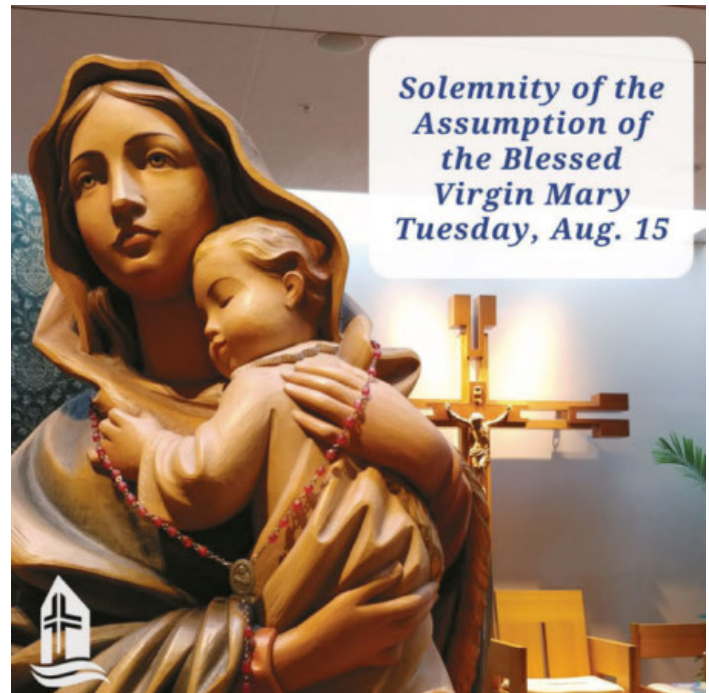

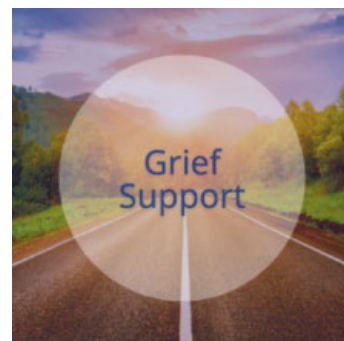

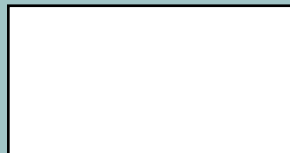
