Extra-Ordinary Time

I write this on the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in this Nineteenth Week in Ordinary Time. We've recently



celebrated St. John Vianney, St. Dominic, St. Lawrence, St. Clare and St. Maximilian Kolbe. We have St. Pius X, the Queenship of Mary, St. Bartholomew, St. Augustine and the Passion of St. John the Baptist to look forward to you. At our staff stand-up meeting this morning, one staff member asked for prayers for the soul of a dear friend, five years departed. Perhaps you have some of your own personal memorials in these weeks as well, some loved ones whose memory you grieve and cherish. Or perhaps you have some personal feast days on your calendar—birthdays, anniversaries of weddings and Baptisms.

We call these weeks Ordinary Time, and what is meant by "ordinary" is something closer to 'ordered' than the connotation of usual, typical or routine. It is ordered because it is not just one repetitive day after another. It is part of our particular path to God, and no day, no step on that path, is insignificant.

Ordered time is divided into two big chunks, one following the Christmas season, and the other following the Easter season. It is the time after the birth of Christ, and the time after the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It is anything but ordinary. It is a time of coming to terms with what that means. In the words of the Church, "it is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ."

It is a time whose weekly rhythm is driven by Fridays and Sundays, Fridays in which we join with Christ crucified in some penitential act and Sundays where we rejoice with our risen Lord and Savior, and whose daily rhythm is often marked by prayers at meals and at bed. It is a time punctuated by particular feasts and fasts, those of the Church universal, the local Church and those of our own families. Each of these is an opportunity for growth and maturation, remembering who we are, who we are a member of, and where, with His grace and our cooperation, we are headed.

Please don't let these many opportunities pass you by. Take each of them as they come. The goal, toward which each of our lives and all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Long live the King! May He reign in our hearts!



Scripture of the Week



"I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch as I am the apostle to the Gentiles..." (Romans 11:13)

Some of the difficulties encountered by the disciples after the death and resurrection of Jesus in the 1st century are still present today. Many of the early disciples believed that Jesus, as a Jew, came to redeem the Jewish people alone. Ironically, Paul, a devout Jew who was one of the fiercest persecutors of the early Christians ended up being the strongest ally of the Gentiles during those times.

Today is not so very different in many regards. People disbelieve and doubt. Some say the whole "church thing" is not for them, that it is past its prime. But today's readings shred that narrative. Jesus did come for the Gentiles as well as the Jews. Back in the 1st century and up until this very day. The Gentile woman persisted in her request that Jesus heal her daughter because she had immovable faith that He could do so. And He did. Pray we have the faith of the outsider to come to Jesus no matter the cost. Because, in the end, no cost is too great and nothing else really matters.


