Follow Jesus, Follow the Science By Fr. Mike Reinhardt

In the twentieth chapter of Acts, Paul quotes Jesus, and reminds the people that "It is more blessed to give than receive." This teaching is ignored and even sneered at by many in our modern consumer culture, whose message seems to be something like more personal consumption will make us happier. Some Christians might articulate the blessings one receives from giving only as "treasures stored up in heaven." While this is certainly a part the blessings we receive from giving, it would be a mistake to overlook the more immediate blessings we receive in this world.

The fundamental reason that it is more blessed to give than to receive is that giving is God's fundamental act of love towards all of creation and, so, giving, more than receiving conforms ourselves more fully to God. When we give, we become more fully who we are made to be.

This may still sound too abstract or remote, so let me offer an analogy: when we eat well and exercise, when we take care of our bodies, we are living, on the physical level, as we are made. We feel better when we do so. The same is true on the spiritual level. It is not merely or solely a question of future rewards, but rather a question of present happiness and fulfillment.

Follow the science! If you do an internet search, you can find many scientific studies that support on a scientific level this teaching of Jesus. None of them try to measure the treasure stored up in heaven. Rather, they focus on what they can measure. Generosity reduces stress and is associated with lower mortality. It is associated with significantly higher feelings of well-being and satisfaction. These studies looked at different types of giving, from monetary, volunteering and the simple everyday generosity of praise and courtesy. All types of giving had benefits for the individual and for their community.

Put it to the test! It is likely as simple as remembering the acts of generosity in your past, and how they made you and others around you feel. Perhaps you can even remember a time when you maybe felt stressed or too busy, yet stepped up to a commitment of giving that you had already made. I bet that most of you can also remember how that act of generosity reduced the stress you were feeling.

Continue to practice generosity! Some of the benefits of volunteering continue past the acts themselves, but, like diet and exercise, they accrue most to those who develop lifelong habits.

I want to bring us back to Jesus, who taught it is better to give than to receive. We want to avoid reducing this teaching to the benefits measurable by science. When we live a life of generosity, we are still storing up for ourselves treasures in heaven. We are still conforming our lives to His. And that is precious beyond measure. But God did make us body and soul, and body and soul He wants us to receive His blessings.
