Our Mission and Ministry at HNOJ

At the bottom of the HNOJ.org website, underneath our parish logo, rests our community mission statement. You've probably heard it. If you were around when we first rolled it out many years ago you may even be able to recite it.

Sharing in the Body of Christ, we seek to Know the heart of Christ, See the face of Christ and Be the hands of Christ.

Poetic and brief, this mission statement calls us to grow in our knowledge of the faith, spend time gazing upon the face of our God, and living our Baptismal call out in the world. Learn, pray and act; all good things. We certainly need to pray that we can live out this challenging call well.

You might have heard a staff member or fellow parishioner shorten this statement to simply, "Know, See, Be." While a good summary of the action we are called to, I think it misses the fundamental foundation of the entire mission.

Sharing in the Body of Christ points to the reality that at HNOJ we Know, we See and we Be - together. We do these actions of faith in communion with each other. At HNOJ, and for all Catholics, faith is personal, but it is never private. We together pray on Sunday, not as the bodies of Christ, but as the Body of Christ. We are united in love and mission. To borrow a phrase from a local football coach - we are all rowing the boat together.

The result of the Archdiocesan Synod showed an overwhelming call for the growth of small groups as a strategy to grow this kind of community at parishes all over the Archdiocese. HNOJ along with our neighboring Catholic Churches are engaging in a multiyear process to grow small groups. This is a heavy life and incredible ask, but one that will benefit all of us. Isn't a God-sized goal exactly what we need to be a community united in love and mission?

This is the reason for the recent construction around HNOJ. The previous Faith Formation office spaces off of the Gathering Space are being converted to small group meeting rooms. Multiple staff members have generously agreed to move their daily work space to make more room for small groups and community-building activities. In addition, because Holy Name of Jesus School enrollment is up, the school is moving walls in order to add more classroom space.

All of this work is being done to:

- better accomplish HNOJ's vision of making disciples of Jesus Christ in the 21st century.
- so that we can share in the Body of Christ, not only during Mass on Sunday, but in our study, our prayer and our service of others.
- to help each of us grow in our faith in Jesus Christ.

Please keep the construction, the mission and the resulting ministry activity in your prayers this fall. And join the mission by signing up for the small group training study starting at the end of September which can be found at www.hnoj.org/synodtraining and also on page three of this newsletter.

Fall Festival Details

Turtle Trot 5K - Saturday, Sept. 16, 10 a.m. Start



Welcome Janna Webskowski, Business Administrator




