

Relics of Three Saints

I have exciting news to share: The major relics of Saint Thérèse and her saint parents, Saints Louis and Zélie Martin, are traveling all the way from their native France to the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. Included in their journey will be a stop at Saint Therese Church in Deephaven, just 15 minutes south of us, from Oct. 12-15. Visiting their relics is an opportunity you do not want to miss!

A relic is a piece of a saint: either a bone, lock of hair, body part or some of their clothing. We as Catholics honor or venerate relics of saints because they remind us that the saints were human, just as we are, and they are in Heaven, just like we can be.



We see this practice in Scripture. God performed a miracle through the bones of Elisha (2 Kings 13:20-21). The sick were healed when Peter's shadow passed over them (Acts 5:14-16). People touched cloths to Paul's hands and laid them on the sick and they were healed (Acts 19:11-12). It is not to say that relics contain magic or that relics themselves heal, only God heals. God recognizes that we are spiritual and material beings, and so God oftentimes employs physical objects as an opportunity for us to experience and receive His grace.

Many people have been encouraged in their own faith journey by the three saints. Whether it is the inviting "little way" of Saint Thérèse or the virtuous example of Louis and Zélie as a married couple working to raise a family, there is something of the lives of these saints to inspire each one of us.



Scripture of the Week



"Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7)

Today our First Reading from Isaiah, our Psalm and our Gospel reading from Matthew all speak of vineyards. The allegory is quite simple, Israel (in the First Reading and Psalm), is God's vineyard. Jesus's parable extends the vineyard to all who belong to Him. We all become vines grafted onto the true vine who is Jesus Himself.

Struggles will come and it can be hard at times to quiet the noise and stay rooted in Christ. How can we persevere? St. Paul shows us the way in our Second Reading - "Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do; and the God of peace will be with you."


Stewardship Invitation, Oct. 14-15




