Scripture of the Week



"I know how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance." (Philippians 4:12)

Many of us struggle with living out the opening phrase of today's Second Reading. St. Paul says he knows how to live with little and also how to live with plenty. Our modern world offers so much plenty, from foods to entertainment to transportation to arts to scientific break throughs to "stuff" of all sorts. And yet, some struggle to find enough basics to live day-to-day while others are burdened with trying to ignore the over-abundance of stimulation of the senses that makes up 21st Century America.

And amid this on-going struggle in a post-pandemic world, we see so many things that have changed. Businesses struggle to find workers as many people step out of the workforce, offices and classrooms become virtual - often leading to a sense of disconnection and so much more. Everything we knew has changed. Or has it? God is still God and His truth is still Truth. If we relied on Him before, then we still find strength in Him today. If we did not, there is still time to run into His arms. Because in our Second Reading, St. Paul also says, "I can do all things in him who strengthens me." And that makes all the difference.
