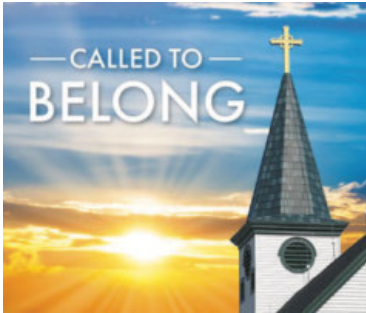

Interfaith Outreach Second Collection, Nov. 4-5

It's time once again to renew our focus on caring for the "least" of our brothers and sisters, right here in our own community. Interfaith's annual Sleep Out will take place from Nov. 14 to Dec. 11, to raise awareness and funds.

Holy Name of Jesus will take up a second collection for Interfaith Outreach on Nov. 4-5, to support their efforts. **Please write checks out to HNOJ with IOCP in the memo.** You can go to hnoj.org/interfaith2ndcollection to learn more and make an online donation.

If you and your family have been blessed, please consider sharing those blessings with the poor and homeless among us. After all, as Jesus says in that passage from Matthew: "...whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Interfaith Outreach Reports:

General Stats / Client Demographics

- In Fiscal Year 2023 (April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023), 1,545 households (4,756 people) worked with us in the following six areas: Food, Family Support, Employment, Transportation, Housing and Neighborhoods and Education and Youth.
- 353 households came to Interfaith Outreach for support for the first time.
- 57% of households included children. 2,096 children were impacted or served by IOCP.
- 405 households had a single caregiver/parent.

Permanent Supportive Housing (transitioning families and individuals from homelessness)

- Fiscal Year 2023, 21 households enrolled vs. 12 in Fiscal Year 2022
- Clients work with case manager and participate in goal setting. In Fiscal Year 2023, 65% of them progressed or achieved their goals.

Emergency Financial Assistance (EFA)

- In Fiscal Year 2023, we provided EFA to 350 households in need of immediate assistance paying medical bills, utilities or to maintain access to housing or transportation. The amount spent on just EFA in Fiscal Year 2023 was \$1,011,772 - an average of \$2890.78 per household.

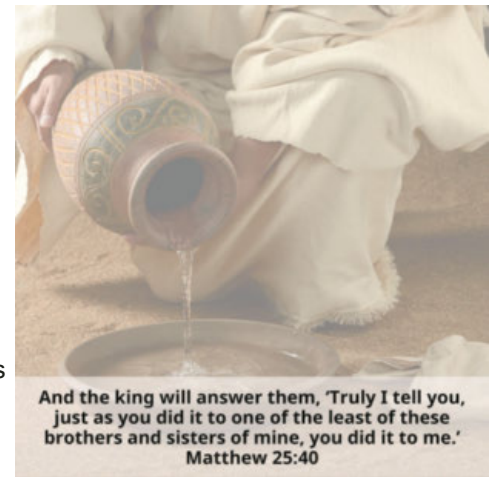
Education and Youth

- The Caring for Kids (CfK) program provides scholarships and other supports for families with preschool-aged children in the Wayzata and Orono public school districts. In Fiscal Year 2023, we provided scholarships for 62 young learners.

Neighborhood Program

- Interfaith staff available on-site to 907 households (rental units) in local affordable housing communities.
- These services stopped 56 of 57 preventable evictions - we helped nearly 60 households be able to stay in our community just within this program.
