Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is at the heart of our faith. In fact the word Eucharist originates from the Greek word eucharistia, meaning thanksgiving. At Thanksgiving, and as we share the Lord's Supper, we return to Him our gratitude, our sacrifice of praise. But it is not meant to stop there. One of the famous lines from the second Vatican council is that the "Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life." One does not see a summit without also seeing the mountain massing beneath. The source flows out of the mountain nourishing, blessing, baptizing. It is a Eucharistic summit, a Eucharistic source.

That spirit of thanksgiving is part of what is meant to flow outwards to all the world. St. Ambrose says that "no duty is more urgent than that of

returning thanks." St. Gianna Beretta Molla writes that "the secret of happiness is to live moment by moment and to thank God for all that He, in His goodness, sends to us day after day."

We give thanks first by paying attention to who and to what God puts in our lives. We cannot give thanks to God for things we don't notice. Slow down. Notice what God is doing, what He wants to happen in your lives. And of course, we give thanks to God, and (not but!) we give thanks to others. If God's gifts come to us through others – and so many of His gifts do – it is fitting to thank them as well. It shows proper gratitude to God to thank those He has put in our lives. Thanking someone may be the easiest way to soften a heart, to bless a person, to say it is good that you are here.

This Thanksgiving let us remember the source of our blessings and summit of our lives and give thanks to God. Let us follow His example and look for ways to pour out His blessings on others through our expressions of gratitude and praise.



Scripture of the Week



"For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night." (1 Thessalonians 5:2)

Last week we were reminded to stay awake for the arrival of the King even as our senses feel fall turning towards the sleep of winter under a blanket of snow. Our Gospel today shows us the result of falling asleep



and not awakening until the King is already back. Each of the three servants in the story depict us and how we await Jesus's return.

The servant entrusted with a single talent reacts in fear of the master - fear of making a bad choice, fear of risking too much, really fear of everything - including a relationship with his master. And so, he does nothing, exerts no effort to tend to what has been left in his care or to try and strengthen his relationship to the master. It is as if he himself crawled into the hole and buried himself with the talent. The other two used the talents given to make even more talents, much to the joy and delight of the master. We are called to be HOLY not "hole-y". Our good and gracious God gives each of us a variety of gifts. Today we are reminded to invest those gifts into His Kingdom and offer them back in service to the Lord.

NPH Christmas Open House, Nov. 26




