



Our Liturgical Year ends today with the celebration of the Solemnity of the Kingship of Jesus Christ. Each year we cycle through one of the synoptic Gospels, beginning in Advent and the celebration of the Solemnity of the

(1 Corinthians 15:22)

Nativity. Then we cycle through the life and earthly ministry of Jesus, culminating in yet again the Solemnity of Christ the King. This is the rhythm of our Liturgical Year, we start at the beginning, anticipating and celebrating the arrival of Jesus, and conclude at the end of time, but NOT the end of everything.

For declaring the return of Christ as King may end time, but it opens a new beginning for each of us outside of time. Take a moment this week to read the entire Gospel Reading, Matthew 25:31-46. It is easy to focus on wanting to be a sheep versus a goat but the real message here is the promise of the King to care for His people even to the point of feeding us - feeding us with His own Flesh and Blood. Here is the ultimate invitation to step out of time and into an eternity, face to face with the King. Next week we begin again with Advent, celebrating His arrival as an infant, but more importantly preparing for His arrival as King. He is the King who loves all. Will we love Him in return? All hail the King!




