# Depth, Peace and Joy

Whenever I first see the purple vestments worn by the priest the First Sunday of Advent, I often think of one explanation: "Purple is for preparation." In Advent, we prepare for two things. First, we prepare for final coming of Jesus at the end of the world or the end of our life, neither of which we know the day or the hour. Second, we prepare for the celebration of Jesus's first coming, Christmas, when he was born of the Virgin Mary.

We do many things to prepare, particularly regarding the latter. Shopping, cleaning, decorating the house, putting up a Christmas tree, wrapping gifts, baking cookies, etc. are all ways we prepare for the celebration. Our celebration of Christmas would feel different without the special traditions and all that we do to make it happen.

Likewise, and more importantly, how or whether we prepare ourselves spiritually affects our experience of the celebration. Without *spiritual* preparation, the celebration of Christmas lacks depth, peace and joy.

To prepare us, the Church gives us four Sundays of Advent where we give God the opportunity to form our hearts for His coming. This year, the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Dec. 24. Understandably, people wonder: Can I just go to one Christmas Eve Mass and have it "count" for both? The simple answer is "No." There is an obligation to participate in two Masses: One for Christmas and one for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. To assist with this obligation, HNOJ will be offering three different Mass times for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, including two anticipatory Masses on Saturday evening Dec. 23 (at 4 p.m. and 5:30 p.m.) and one Sunday morning Dec. 24 (at 9 a.m.). Remember, though, this is more than fulfilling an obligation. It is about giving God the opportunity to prepare us to celebrate His coming. In doing so, we will dispose ourselves to experience the kind of celebration we truly desire, one that is marked by depth, peace and joy.

# NPH Mexico Mission Trip, July 2024

We have some exciting news to share about a few changes to our annual NPH Mission Trip. We are headed back to NPH Mexico! And it's open to ALL parishioners: it is no longer a youth ministry trip!

Holy Name of Jesus has had a longstanding partnership with Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH). NPH is a charitable organization serving orphaned and abandoned children in Latin America and the Caribbean. Its' mission is to provide shelter, food, clothing, healthcare and education in a Christian family environment based on unconditional acceptance and love, sharing, working and responsibility.

We are heading back to NPH Mexico, from July 24-31, 2024. NPH will be celebrating their 70th anniversary in 2024. Founded in 1954 by Fr. William Wasson in Cuernavaca, Mexico when a young man stole the money from the collection box in his chapel. Rather than have him jailed for his crime, Fr. Wasson offered to take him in, giving him shelter, food and an education. In a short amount of time, Fr. Wasson took in another 30 boys. Today Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (Our Little Brothers and Sisters) has homes in nine countries in Central and South America and supports over 8,000 children.

During our time there, we will immerse ourselves in the daily lives and culture of the children of NPH Mexico by working, eating and playing alongside the pequeños who call NPH home. We will build relationships that have a lasting impact on their lives and our own.

### Important Details:

This mission trip is open to ALL parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus. All those interested from 16 years old to adult are welcome to fill out an interest form application to attend. Students 14 and 15 years old are welcome to attend with a parent or legal guardian. Only 19 spots are available. **Our focus will be doing service projects at the home, in the school, the gardens, the clinic and the kitchen.** Each day will end with reflection and prayer.

### Travel:

- This unique travel opportunity includes transportation from Mexico City to Miacatlan, Mexico for a stay at Casa San Salvador, which is the first home of NPH.
- During the week, we will travel to Cuernavaca, Mexico where we will tour the first chapel of Fr. Wasson, founder of NPH.
- We will visit Casa Buen Señior and the high school in Cuernavaca.
- We will include a stop at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe to see Juan Diego's tilma and tour the grounds of Tepeyac Hill before departing from Mexico City.

In this season of giving, we know that some of you may wish to make a special calendar year-end gift to your spiritual family, the HNOJ parish community. If you're planning a year-end gift, please note:



- The IRS requires that checks must be received by Dec. 31 or earlier in order to be credited to the current tax year.
- If you plan to "bunch" your charitable donations to HNOJ, please let us know so that we can plan accordingly for our cash flow.
- Gifts of appreciated stock enable you to make a contribution and maximize your tax benefit.
- Stocks must be transferred by Dec. 22 for credit in tax year 2023. Please notify the parish office prior to any stock transfer so that we can ensure your transfer and gift receipt are handled properly.
- Check with your employer to determine whether a matching gift from your company can double the value of your contribution to HNOJ School or Church.
- Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from an IRA account may provide tax benefits. Contact your financial advisor if you wish to make a charitable gift from your account. If you do make such a distribution, please notify us so that we can provide you with a receipt that meets IRS requirements.

## Set Up and Manage Your Electronic/ Automatic Contributions through WeShare 2.0 Online Giving

Holy Name of Jesus utilizes WeShare 2.0 Online Giving to allow for easy management of contributions. Through WeShare 2.0, you may use a bank account, debit or credit card to give to any collection, schedule automated donations and view payment history on payments made through WeShare 2.0.

It is easy to use, much like when you shop online or pay your bills online. Set up a one-time or recurring donation basically in three easy steps:

1. Go to www.hnoj.org/online-donations to access WeShare 2.0

2. Select the collection you wish to donate to and click to make a donation.

3. Enter your payment information.

That's it. You can login at any time to edit your donation or to view your donations made through WeShare 2.0.

When we first set up this system, we used the email address on file. You may have created another account by using another email. If you have difficulty, please contact the parish office.

## How do I reset my password?

Click the "If you have forgotten your password, click here" link and WeShare 2.0 will send a temporary password to your email.

## How do I create an account?

The first time you use WeShare 2.0 to make an online donation or register for an event, you will be given the option of creating an account. Just walk through the wizard.
