Happy New Liturgical Year!

"Of every other child that is born into the world, friends can say that it resembles his mother. This was the first instance in time that anyone could say that the mother resembled the Child. This is the beautiful paradox of the Child who made His mother; the mother, too was only a child. It was also the first time in the history of this world that anyone could ever think of heaven as being anywhere else than "somewhere up there"; when the Child was in her arms, Mary now looked down to Heaven."

Happy New Year! As we begin a new liturgical year, we are once again given the opportunity to enter into the mysteries of the incarnation. This first Sunday of Advent, Jesus invites us to be watchful, to be alert! Jesus uses the image of a gatekeeper alert for his master's return. I invite us to use the image of a child peeking around the corner and down the stairs watchful for some of the "behind-the-scenes" magic of Christmas. There is a joy, an excitement, a childlike sense of wonder in the child that, to me at least, is not present in the image of the gatekeeper waiting for his master. These are all qualities that we are called to cultivate in our own alertness as we wait for our master.

We have heard these stories from the Gospels year after year, and so we may presume a familiarity with what is going on that we may have only at a surface level. Our presumed familiarity (and our busy-ness!) too often obscures the wondrous strangeness of how God came to meet us as a newborn babe.

That is why I value insights like Fulton Sheen's. They shake us out of the

routine. They help us go deeper than that surface familiarity and see what is happening in a deeper, truer way. They are aids in re-awakening within us that childlike sense of alertness that enters into the wonder and excitement of the season anew year after year.

Happy New Year! May your Advent be alert, and may your Christmas be merry and bright!


Masses for the Fourth Sunday of Advent


Saturday, Dec. 23, at 4 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 24, at 9 a.m.







Scripture of the Week



"But according to His promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells." (2 Peter 3:13)

In our First Reading from Isaiah we hear "make straight in the wasteland a highway for the Lord!" We hear John the Baptizer repeat the phrase in today's Gospel as "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths." This is the work we are called to on this Second Sunday of Advent. It is that call to "Shape up!" that Fr. Arnold used to refer to the Second Sunday of Advent.



Advent is the time to prepare for the arrival of our Savior. We look to history to remember the readings and remember the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem so long ago. But more importantly, we prepare for His second coming. The call of the prophet, the call of the baptizer harken us not just to the past but also to our present and our future. Each year the Church in her wisdom gives us the Season of Advent to prepare for the "adventus" (the arrival) that is to come when Jesus arrives in Glory as King of the Universe present here on Earth.
