What does our Lord say about renewal? It's easy to get caught up in what I want to get better at or what I think my life needs but what does God say that I need? Cue Genesis chapters one and two.

Recently, I've been leading a Bible Study on Sundays (shout out to our young adults woot!) that breaks down our creation story as how it was originally intended to be understood – ancient, near-east poetry. In it we make a remarkable discovery hidden within the text. It's all about Sabbath! (Check out the BEMA podcast if you want to learn more about this).

This concept is at the center of the text, which in the context of the original audience reading it, is the whole point. It literally can't be emphasized more! God gives us a day to stop everything we're doing to simply be with Him and be with our loved ones. The author of the podcast simplifies how his family does Sabbath as "we rest, we play, no work, God loves us."

What this means is that if you're asking, "how do I do Sabbath" you're missing the point. This is for you to take a day away from the busyness and anxieties of the world to truly rest and that looks a little different for everyone. Here are some suggestions:

- Read
- Nap
- Walk
- Eat (love this one)
- Play a game and/or sport

This day is not meant as time to catch up on things or mindlessly sit on the internet or watch tv all day but to truly "re-create" ourselves in God's image. **It's like a holiday but without the stress of buying gifts or the stress of an overpacked schedule!** Rest, worship, that is all.

God is not trying to punish us by demanding that we do this but because He knows our human hearts and what we really need to flourish.

So instead of just adding another personal improvement project as a New Year's resolution maybe consider the invitation God made in the beginning. Try it and see how He wants to bless you.

Archdiocesan Synod Implementation Update

It has been a little over a year since we received the pastoral letter from Archbishop Hebda, "I Will Give You Witnesses." In it, he highlights the needs of the people in our Archdiocese as well as desires for formation and growth. The three focal points that came to light through the Holy Spirit were:

- 1. Small Group Ministry
- 2. The Holy Eucharist
- 3. The Family as the Primary Educators of the Faith

We're focusing on small group ministry this year and boy, what a response! In September we started training our small group leaders through a seven-week formation series provided by the Archdiocese and had over 125 parishioners signed up! While not all of them will go on to be small group leaders, we received the "pool" of disciples committed to making this implementation feasible. To all those that participated, THANK YOU!

We have a model for these small groups in which our leaders were trained called "Parish Evangelization Cells System." The seven-step method ensures time for prayer, sharing, formation, discussion, announcements, intercession and healing. Learn more about the seven steps and history at cells-evangelisation.org

What now? Well, the answer is always prayer. Pray to the Lord of the harvest for these small group "workers" and the mission they've undertaken. A main theme of the fall series was Eucharistic Adoration and prayers of praise and thanksgiving which all are invited to partake in. The next step is to discern!

This Lent we will be launching these new small groups that take on the great commission to "go out to all the world baptizing in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit!" The topic is still in the works but the **groups will start the first** week of Lent (Feb. 11-17) and wrap up before Easter. *We want YOU to be in one of these groups!* Sign up weekends will take place this January. Keep an eye out in the Gathering Space, on the website and at Mass!

The goal of these small groups is twofold:

- 1. To offer a time and place that meets regularly that fosters Catholic friendship and formation in the teachings and life of our Lord Jesus Christ for current as well as new parishioners.
- 2. To offer a "shallow entry point" into which we can invite non-Catholics as well! A. neighbor, a family member, your mailman, etc. Have a friend that's curious about the faith but is unsure about the next step? Invite them to "come and see" your small group.

The hope is that these small groups will continue on after our Lenten focus to incorporate other Christian themes while living out the Christian faith with others in a small community. The plan will be to launch new small groups again, come September with another Parish-wide focus of formation (hint, hint, it will have something to do with the Eucharist!)

Baking for Babies Pro-Life Cinnamon Roll Sale, Jan 19-21

Two of the sweetest things in the world are babies and deliciously glazed cinnamon rolls. A Community Caring for Life (ACCL) is hosting Baking for Babies Pro-Life Cinnamon Roll Bake and Sale event Jan. 19-21. This will be the 32nd year the ACCL has put on this event. This tradition started in January because it's the same month and anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade decision when the Supreme Court legalized abortion on demand in all 50 states in 1973.

We are pleased that on June 24, 2022, Supreme Court case Dobbs vs. Jackson Women's Center overturned Roe vs. Wade, placing the writing and enforcement of abortion legislation on individual states. In Minnesota the reality is abortion remains legal, and many laws that were in place to protect and support women and their preborn child are gone.

At Holy Name of Jesus, ACCL will continue to support women facing unexpected pregnancy or challenging pregnancies. Pope Francis reminds us, "Our parishes need to be islands of mercy in the midst of a sea of indifference." Our bishops, pastors and parish leaders want our church members to be informed on how to help. Everyone in our parish should know where to refer a pregnant woman in need. While we put on our most well-known pro-life event of the year, the ACCL is offering you a chance to get to know the organizations we will be supporting. If you're volunteering to frost or assemble cinnamon rolls, you will have the opportunity to meet one of them.

The ACCL committee will give the money raised from our Baking for Babies event to organizations like *Pro Life Action Ministries* and *Pro Life Across America*. They speak messages of hope and encouragement by counseling on the sidewalk or phone to abortion-minded women. *SouthWest Options for Women* (SWOW) in Eden Prairie, *Crystal Women's Clinic* (CWC), *Abria* in Minneapolis and St. Paul, are pregnancy resource centers near us offering free pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, education, counseling and supplies for mothers to make that life choice an easier one. Lastly, *Elevate Life* is an organization that provides staff and volunteer training, marketing assistance, special grants and more to their affiliate pregnancy resource centers.

NPH Mexico Mission Trip, July 2024 Applications Due!

We are so excited to be headed back to NPH Mexico for this year's mission trip! And this trip is now open to ALL parishioners: it is no longer a youth ministry trip.

Holy Name of Jesus has had a longstanding partnership with Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH). NPH is a charitable organization serving orphaned and abandoned children in Latin America and the Caribbean. Its mission is to provide shelter, food, clothing, healthcare and education in a Christian family environment based on unconditional acceptance and love, sharing, working and responsibility.

We are heading back to NPH Mexico, from July 24-31, 2024. NPH will be celebrating their 70th anniversary in 2024. Founded in 1954 by Fr. William Wasson in Cuernavaca, Mexico when a young man stole the money from the collection box in his chapel. Rather than have him jailed for his crime,



Fr. Wasson offered to take him in, giving him shelter, food and an education. In a short amount of time, Fr. Wasson took in another 30 boys. Today Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (Our Little Brothers and Sisters) has homes in nine countries in Central and South America and supports over 8,000 children.

During our time there, we will immerse ourselves in the daily lives and culture of the children of NPH Mexico by working, eating and playing alongside the pequeños who call NPH home. We will build relationships that have a lasting impact on their lives and our own.

Important Details:

This mission trip is open to ALL parishioners of Holy Name of Jesus. All those interested from 16 years old to adult are welcome to fill out an interest form application to attend. Students 14 and 15 years old are welcome to attend with a parent or legal guardian. Only 19 spots are available. **Our focus will be doing service projects at the home, in the school, the gardens, the clinic and the kitchen.** Each day will end with reflection and prayer.

Travel:

- This unique travel opportunity includes transportation from Mexico City to Miacatlan, Mexico for a stay at Casa San Salvador, which is the first home of NPH.
- During the week, we will travel to Cuernavaca, Mexico where we will tour the first chapel of Fr. Wasson, founder of NPH.
- We will visit Casa Buen Señior and the high school in Cuernavaca.
- We will include a stop at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe to see Juan Diego's tilma and tour the grounds of Tepeyac Hill before departing from Mexico City.

Wise Men See God in the Simple Things

If you're on social media, you have probably seen a meme going around that features this quote: "God has a plan for your life. The enemy has a plan for your life. Be ready for both. Just be wise enough to know which one to battle and which one to embrace."

There were certainly two competing plans for the Magi: God's and Herod's. And, wise as they supposedly were, it wasn't entirely easy for the Magi to discern which was which.

After all, Herod posed as a friend. He offered the Magi hospitality and kindness. Though the Gospel doesn't say so, he probably flattered them and appealed to every moral weakness he could observe in them. In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort – rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Magi were honest with themselves, I'll bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in



his presence. When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe.

The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love. Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.
